PENTECOST SUNDAY

If you go back and read the Old Testament, you will discover that Pentecost was one of the Jewish feast days. Only they didn't call it Pentecost as that is the Greek name. The Jews called it the Feast of Harvest or the Feast of Weeks. It was the celebration of the beginning of the early weeks of the Spring harvest. Pentecost, in the time of the disciples, was a great and grand harvest celebration. The streets of Jerusalem would have been filled with thousands of pilgrims who had come from everywhere to celebrate the goodness of God and the bringing in of the wheat harvest.

Pentecost is reminiscent of the Last Supper. In both instances, the disciples are together in a house for what proves to be an important event. At the Last Supper, the disciples witness the end of the Messiah's earthly ministry as He asks them to remember Him after His death until He returns. At Pentecost, the disciples witness the birth of the New Testament church in the coming of the Holy Spirit to dwell in all believers.



FINANCIAL UPDATE

Ct Example and Ct Clare of Applei Darigh

January - March, 2023, First Quarter Financial Results

Thank you for your contributions to our parish. Ordinary revenue, mostly Sunday contributions, is up by \$15,000 with most of the increase from e-transfers and loose collections. Operating expenses are up by \$30,000. This is mostly due to increases in Church expenses - insurance and snowplowing - and additions to human resources. Extraordinary revenue is slightly higher than last year.

Our first quarter parish results were budgeted to be a deficit as we improve administrative support to better meet the needs of our amalgamated parish. Consequently, the deficit in this quarter was \$60,000 compared to a \$47,000 deficit in the same period last year.

Please consider your parish community in your regular monthly expenses. Your comments, questions and suggestions about parish finances are welcome.

St Theresa's Church April 2023 My Extra Help Update

St Theresa's Church is delighted to announce that as of the end of April 2023, we have raised \$12,925 towards our annual fundraising goal of \$30,000, which is 43% of their target.

Our Easter Weekend fundraiser has helped greatly. Our sales combined with a generous donation that more than doubled our sales allowed us to raise \$4,010.

DIOCESE NEWS

Class Action: Claims Period

The Claims period of the class action suit filed against the Archdiocese of Halifax-Yarmouth runs from December 14, 2022 until December 14, 2023. Individuals who wish to make a claim to receive settlement benefits have 12 months in which they can make a formal claim. See notice below.

This notice was approved by the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia

NOTICE OF SETTLEMENT IN CLASS ACTION

To all individuals who were sexually abused by a priest of the Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Halifax or Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Yarmouth between April 14, 1954 and March 31, 2020 and have not previously settled or otherwise released either the Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Halifax or Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Yarmouth.

The Court has approved a settlement which provides compensation to eligible class members who file a claim for sexual assault and meet the requirements of the claims process.

If you opted out of the class action, the settlement will not impact you.

If you are part of the lawsuit as a Class Member, you can submit a claim for a payment of money as compensation. The amount of money that you may receive will depend on the specifics of the claim you submit. The potential amount of money to be paid to a Class Member whose claim is accepted will likely range from \$30,000 to \$350,000.

You must submit your claim for compensation before December 14, 2023. If you do not submit your claim for compensation before December 14, 2023, you will lose your right to compensation.
