#### <u>DIOCESAN CLERGY RETREAT – NO PARISH WEEKDAY</u> MASSES THIS WEEK




Diocesan clergy along with Archbishop Dunn will gather for their annual time of retreat this coming week. Let us pray that it is a time of rest and renewal for our

#### **RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS - PART 7 FROM THE DIOCESE**



We are mindful of the work we must do to help all learn more about the dark history of our country and our Church when it comes to the relationship with

Indigenous communities. In that light we continue our ten-part weekly series on residential schools.

The level of education was limited to the basics and fell far short of the non-indigenous school curriculum. Even after many years of schooling, many students could barely read or write. They were largely seen and treated as being "less capable" and even "unteachable". The few hours that were spent in class were on rote learning (memorization) and the teaching of religion. There was little to no consideration given to post-secondary education.

Most of the day was taken up by menial tasks (the washing of clothes, working on the farm, helping in the kitchen). Federal funding was extremely limited; residential schools found many different ways to employ their students to help minimize costs. Class sizes were also extremely large, and supervisors were grossly outnumbered. Children slept on cots in big

halls: the boys on one side, the girls on the other. Schools were drafty and poorly heated. Some were notorious fire traps.

Though many staff members did their best under difficult circumstances, and there were many attempts made to get the federal government to increase funding, unacceptable conditions persisted and became part of the norm, jeopardizing the welfare of the students.

The 115 km route begins at Holy Cross Church, Middle Musquodoboit, and ends at Saint Michael Church, Spryfield in the Parish of Stella Maris on the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The daily program for the pilgrimage, in addition to the 12 – 24 km walk each day, will include meals, water stations along the route, basecamp hospitality, and community sharing.
