## **FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING**




This Sunday, we celebrate the end of another liturgical year, as we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King.

Dear faithful of Saint Francis and Saint Clare Parish,

On Wednesday I met with Fr. Nathanael and members of parish leadership to begin to formulate a plan to support you.

I wish to announce that Archbishop Martin Currie has agreed to provide pastoral support to the parish and assist Father Nathanael with the spiritual care of the people of Saint Francis and Saint Clare parish.

Additionally, I have appointed two members of my staff to work closely with your parish leadership team to continue to advance the administrative work of your parish.

Your leaders also raised some questions regarding Fr. Pio's withdrawal of faculties for pastoral ministry. Father Pio has confirmed his part in these allegations. Plans to care for all involved, including counselling, are underway. As you can understand providing significant details is impossible out of respect for the privacy of everyone involved. I also wish to restate that this matter does not involve minors.

While I understand the situation is difficult, I ask you to show kindness and respect and pray for everyone involved.

May Saints Francis and Saint Clare intercede for all of us at this time.

On Sunday, November 27<sup>th</sup>, the Season begins! We invite everyone to the Church Hall following the 11:00 am and 7:00 pm Masses that day to BRING ADVENT HOME by making an Advent Wreath for your home. Everything you

need to make the wreath will be supplied. All you will need to bring is a pair of clippers/cutters to assist in trimming the wreath.

We would like to ask for your help in providing some light snacks, muffins, sweets, etc., for us to enjoy while we make our wreaths. A sign-up sheet will be available at the back of the Church so that we can ensure we have enough food to share. Refreshments will be provided.

The circle of the Advent Wreath, with no beginning and no end, reminds us of God. The wreath is often made of branches that remind us of living things. There are four candles on the wreath. The four candles (3 purple, 1 pink)



represent the four Sundays of Advent. Each Sunday, another candle is lit. At Church, we add a fifth candle, which is white and lit at Christmas. It is called the "Christ Candle" and represents the life of Jesus Christ that has come into the world.




We are asking all parishioners to participate in inviting our brothers and sisters who have fallen away from celebrating their

#### **STATUS OF SAINTE-MARIE CHURCH IN CHURCHPOINT**

Sainte-Marie



Last week, Archbishop Dunn was advised by the local community group, Société Edifice Sainte-Marie de la Pointe, that they have been unable to raise the funds

needed to renovate and preserve Sainte Marie Church in Churchpoint, NS. The Société has worked hard for

nine years to find a way to keep the church building going and have unfortunately not been successful. Two weeks ago, they circulated a media release to this effect.

Discussions between the Société and the Archdiocese of Halifax-Yarmouth have been on-going over many years to determine how the Société might take ownership of the church building of Sainte-Marie. Most recently, they were given an extension to September 30, 2022, to raise the funds. Due to a variety of circumstances, they will not continue with their efforts.

We are saddened about how this will impact a piece of Acadian history in that region of our Diocese, but we also acknowledge the reality of the situation for all involved. The Archdiocese will work with the leadership at Paroisse Notre Dame d'Acadie, of which Sainte Marie Church is a part, to determine the best next steps.
