

Food Pantry Month for St. Andrew's

August is St. Andrew's month to operate the Oxford Food Pantry. The pandemic has resulted in more needy families and changes in procedures. The Pantry Board requires masks to be worn at all times. Sanitizer, gloves, and masks will be available for stocking on Mondays and Tuesdays and for the distributions on Wednesdays and Thursdays.

Chickens continue to arrive early on alternating Monday mornings around 7:30. Stocking on Tuesdays remain the same, 8 to 10 am. New distribution measures are in place for Wednesday and Thursday shopping. There will be NO client contact; clients do not leave their cars. When clients pull in, a "parking lot person" will give them a simple form to complete and will place a number on their car. The form then goes to a "shopper" (us) who will fill the cart inside. This cart then goes to a parking lot person. Quite stream-lined.

Six to eight volunteers are needed to stock on Tuesday. Twelve volunteers are needed from 8:30 to 11:00, including two or three for the parking lot on Wednesday and Thursday. So we will keep a careful chart of who will be volunteering and on which days. Masks must be worn on all four days.

Your financial support of the pantry would be greatly appreciated too. Please make your check to St. Andrew's with food pantry in the memo line. St. Andrew's closed its books on the second quarter with \$20,000 cash on hand. Reduced activities due to the pandemic have eliminated some expenses — such as Vacation Bible School and Sunday school materials. On the debit side, major fixed costs, such as salaries, insurance, and utilities — remain unchanged.

On the other hand, increases in certain expenditures, for example the increased need for local services such as the Food Pantry and Interfaith Compassion Ministry, have occurred. Janitorial services and supplies have also increased in our efforts to limit the spread of the corona virus and infection. Nor have the risks of the pandemic deterred the ramp building team from its mission.

On balance, the families of St. Andrew's continue their faithfull commitment to its ministries and missions.
