Word	Alphabet Pronoun Definition	Logical Definition
Agender	Refers to a complete or partial lack of sexual attraction or lack of interest in sexual activity.	There are 2 different genders, male and female. There is a .018% chance of potentially having a chromosomal abnormality in which an individual may be intersex.
Aromantic	Individuals who do not experience romantic attraction toward individuals of any gender	Little or no attraction to people
Binary	Identifying as being both a boy and a girl	Consists of 2 things or parts. Most often used as values 0 and 1 in computing.
Bioromantic	Romantic attraction toward males and females	God desires relationships to be between a man and a woman.
Bisexual	A person emotionally, romantically or sexually attracted to more than one gender, though not necessarily simultaneously, in the same way or to the same degree.	God desires relationships to be between a man and a woman.
Boy / Man	Having a gender identity that is the opposite of female	A person with XY chromosomes, testes, and penis
Cisgender	A person whose sex was assigned male at birth and identifies as a boy or a man, or someone whose sex was assigned female at birth and identifies	Term for someone who exclusively identifies as their sex assigned at birth

Demigender	Individuals who feel a partial connection to a particular gender identity	There are 2 different genders, male and female. There is a .018% chance of potentially having a chromosomal abnormality in which an individual may be intersex.
Demiromantic	An individual who does not experience romantic attraction until after a close emotional bond has been formed. People who refer to themselves as demiromantic may choose to further specify the gender(s) of those they are attracted to (e.g. demi-homoromantic).	God desires relationships to be between a man and a woman.
Emotional Attraction	Attraction characterized by the desire to connect with others on a deep emotional level. This could look like wanting to become best friends with someone or feeling emotionally “drawn” to someone based on their personality.	Attraction to the mind, personality, and heart of a person
Gender Dysphoria	Clinically significant distress caused when a person's assigned birth gender is not the same as the one with which they identify.	Characterized by a strong, persistent cross gender identification associated with anxiety, depression, irritability, and often a wish to live as the gender not assigned as birth
Gender Expression	Describes the way in which one presents themselves. May include	There are 2 different genders, male and female.

	physical appearance, clothing, hairstyles, and/or behavior.	
Gender-Fluid	A person who does not identify with a single fixed gender or has a fluid or unfixed gender identity.	There are 2 different genders, male and female.
Gender Identity	Describes one's own internal understanding and experience of gender. Each person's experience with their gender identity is unique and personal.	There are 2 different genders, male and female.
Gender non-conforming	People who do not follow other people's ideas or stereotypes about how they should look or act based on the female or male sex they were assigned at birth	There are 2 different genders, male and female.
Genderqueer	People whose gender identity and/or gender expression falls outside the binary categories of man and woman. They may define their gender as falling somewhere in between man and woman, or they may define it as wholly different from these terms.	There are 2 different genders, male and female.
Girl / Woman	Having a gender identity that is the opposite of male	A person with XX chromosomes, ovary(s), and a vagina. The ability to grow offspring in the uterus.
Gray-Romantic	Term used to describe individuals who feel as though their sexuality falls somewhere on the spectrum of	God desires relationships to be between a man and a woman.

He/Him/His	Pronouns for someone who might identify as male	Masculine Pronouns
Heteroromantic	Romantic attraction toward person(s) of a different gender	God desires relationships to be between a man and a woman.
Homoromantic	Romantic attraction towards person(s) of the same gender	God desires relationships to be between a man and a woman.
In a civil union	A marriage-like relationship, created primarily as a means to provide recognition in law for same-sex couples	God desires relationships to be between a man and a woman.
In a domestic partnership	A relationship, usually between couples, who live together and share a common domestic life, but are not married	God desires marriage between one man and one woman.
Intersex	Someone that identifies as multiple genders. This is a choice.	The term used when a person has chromosomal abnormalities with the female and male sex characteristics including genitalia, hormones, chromosomes, and/or reproductive organs. This is a chromosomal abnormality and not a choice.
Lesbian	A woman who is emotionally, romantically or sexually attracted to other women. Women and non-binary	Refers to a woman who has a romantic and/or sexual orientation toward another woman

Non-Binary	Term that refers to people who don't experience their gender(s) as completely a girl/woman or boy/man.	A mathematical process that only needs one number to accomplish something
Pansexual	Describes someone who has the potential for emotional, romantic or sexual attraction to people of any gender though not necessarily simultaneously, in the same way or to the same degree.	God desires relationships to be between a man and a woman.
Panromantic	Romantic attraction towards persons of every gender(s)	God desires relationships to be between a man and a woman.
Polyromantic	Romantic attraction toward multiple, but not all genders	God desires relationships to be between a man and a woman.
Queer	A term people often use to express a spectrum of identities and orientations that are counter to the mainstream. Queer is often used as a catch-all to include many people, including those who do not identify as exclusively straight and/or folks who have non-binary or gender-expansive identities. This term was previously used as a slur, but has been reclaimed by many parts of the LGBTQ+ movement.	An adjective meaning strange or odd

Romantic Attraction	Described as the desire for romantic intimacy or romantic relationships with others.	Expressions of love
Sexual Attraction	Characterized by the desire to be sexually intimate with other people.	Desire for intimately physical or sexual contact with someone.
Sexual Orientation	Includes different forms of attraction, behaviors, and identities.	One who you are drawn to romantically, emotionally, sexually
Sex Assigned at Birth	When we are born, doctors decide whether “female” or “male” will be listed on our birth certificate. sex assignment at birth is typically based solely on one’s genitals.	There are 2 different types of sex assigned at birth, male or female. There is a .018% chance of potentially having a chromosomal abnormality in which an individual may be intersex.
She/her/hers	Pronouns for someone who might identify as female	Feminine Pronouns
They/them/theirs	Pronouns for someone who might not identify strictly as male or female	Pronouns for groups of people
Third Gender	Category of people who do not identify as male or female, but rather as neither, both, or a combination of male and female genders.	There are 2 different genders, male and female.
Transitioning	Transitioning can refer to any social, legal, and/or medical steps individuals take to affirm their gender identity or gender expression.	There is no logic in gender transitioning
Two-Spirit	Term used within some Indigenous	There are 2 different genders, male
