Florida League of Cities Annual Conference for 2019

The Florida League of Cities Annual Conference, was held from August 14th through August 17th. One of the items done at the Conference was that the Policy Committees would be voting on priorities for the coming 2020 Legislative Session. In the Municipal Administration Policy Committee, we voted on the issue of Vacation Rentals as our priority with the understanding that this year we would be much more pro-active that we had been



in previous years. In the past several Sessions, the position was either to support or fight against specific bills on this issue. This year we will be putting together legislation that addresses the concerns of cities to be able to regulate city ordinances and protect the homes in the same neighborhoods as the vacation rentals.

The Conference also included a number of workshops I found very helpful and I will be building on what I learned in those workshops in the coming months. One of the workshops addressed how to build more community into a city. I am looking to utilize some of the ideas during the

month of October in conjunction with Florida City Government Week.
