- You will need to check in at **FMC Surgical Services Registration** : see time above
- Nothing to eat or drink 8 hours prior to procedure
- If your procedure is scheduled after noon you may have a light breakfast before 5 am (tea or juice, toast or cereal)
- Most medications may be taken that morning with a small amount of water (including Aspirin or Plavix)
- Medications that should **NOT** be taken the morning of procedure:

Diuretics: Lasix, Furosemide, Hydrochlorothiazide (HCTZ)

Diabetic: Glipizide, Glyburide, Metformin, Actos, Avandia, Janumet, Glucophage, Kazano, Metaglip, Glucovance, Jentadueto, Actoplus met, Avandamet, Kombiglyze and Januvia

Diabetics on Insulin should only take ½ the usual amount of Insulin

Coumadin (Warfarin) must be stopped _____ days prior to the procedure date

Pradaxa (dabigatran), Eliquis (apixaban) and Xarelto (rivaroxaban) will need to be stopped _____ hours prior to procedure.

Additional Information:

- You **MUST** have someone who can drive you home and stay with you the remainder of the day and night following the procedure.
- The procedure may take anywhere from 30 minutes to 2 hours or more. Plan to be in the recovery area for 2 to 5 hours following the procedure.
- Plan on the possibility of staying in the hospital overnight if an intervention (angioplasty or stenting) is performed.
