Loatarama has the wind at its back and is full steam ahead, giving back to the LGBTQ community. At Hunters Nightclub on Oct. 10, they distributed \$110,000 to organizations helping LGBTQ vouth.

Hundreds packed the bar for the event, hosted by local activist Jacob Reide Jennings. FLoatarama has been making waves in the local nonprofit community. What started in June 2020 as a pandemic band-aid to have some sort of Pride parade has blossomed into an annual Pride kickoff event that raises money for local causes.

The mood in the room was joyous.

This year's total set a record for the young organization, up from \$75,000 in 2023. The total raised over three years is \$252,134.
