



How did you learn about Jesus?

Think back over your childhood to when you heard stories from the bible. Did you learn about Jonah and the whale from flannel felt boards in Sunday School? Was VBS the best week of summer with crafts, snacks, and songs that stuck in your brain for months? Maybe your parents or grandparents read from a family bible, and every year you dressed in special clothes to experience the awe of a hushed, candlelit Christmas Eve service. And if you didn't go to church, chances are at some point you watched the annual re-run of The Ten Commandments with Charlton Heston as Moses (a 1956 top-rated movie)! If you could pick just one, what would be your favorite story in the Bible? Maybe it's David and Goliath, or the birth of baby Jesus with all the animals gathered round, or the woman at the well. One day, an eight-year-old child took a Bible, dated 1872, off the bookshelf and found inside a "lesson picture card". The



front displayed Jesus in his humble robe and the rich ruler in his fancy garments. The back told the Bible story with several follow-up questions. Here's the gist: A rich young ruler ran to Jesus and asked how he might have eternal life; he had kept the 10 commandments all his life. Jesus loved him but said he lacked one thing. He told him to sell all his goods and give the money to the poor and he would have treasure in heaven; and to come, follow Me. The young ruler went away sad for he owned much property. Jesus said it was hard for the wealthy to enter the kingdom of God. The summary: we must love God best or we break the first commandment. The good news: God can change the heart and make it love him better than all other things. 12 questions followed this story, and it was amazing that this 8-yearold knew every single answer, just from hearing the story one time and looking at the pictures on the card.

God has continued to reveal His love and wisdom throughout history. Every day, Listen Love Pray has a front row seat as Jesus comforts and heals and strengthens folks in the most beautiful

A Message from the Executive Director

Stories stick, facts fade. That mantra from the Global Leadership Summit points to the style Jesus employed when He taught about the Kingdom of God, using approximately 100 metaphors and at least 36 parables. Over and over, He told people to "follow Me" and that meant not only to follow what He did, but also how He did it.

Gen Z needs our help to know about Jesus. This group, which includes anyone between the ages of 6 and 22, has been less influenced by Christianity than any previous generation. Many of their parents (engaged Christian parents eager for their children to develop a lasting faith), "lack clarity on how to disciple their children well in a decidedly post-Christian context" (2018 Barna study, https://www. barna.com/research/parents-and-pastors-partners-in-gen-z-discipleship/). Billy Graham said, the greatest legacy one can pass on to one's children and grandchildren is not money or other material things, but rather a legacy of character and faith. While discipling young people in today's culture may seem intimating, talking about Jesus (one of the first steps) might not be as hard as some folks believe.

When we share personal testimonies of what the love of Jesus has done for us, Holy Spirit infuses our simple words with power and inspiration. Our part is simply to tell our stories! The beautiful children shown in this edition represent only a small sample of the little people in our spheres of influence; each one precious to their earthly families and beloved by our heavenly Father. Add to that number, all of us adults, who are encouraged by the scriptures to "become like little children" (Luke 18:17, Mark 10:15) so that we can enter the Kingdom of heaven, and there are a ton of opportunities. To whom will you tell a Jesus story to this week?



and personal ways. Although our ministry is confidential, when someone gives their permission, we love to tell the current-day stories of Jesus and His love.



"Tell Me the Stories of Jesus" was written c. 1885 by William Henry Parker (1845-1929). William was the head of an insurance company, and he was a devoted member of the Chelsea Street Baptist Church, in Nottingham, England, where he was active in the Sunday School. When William's Sunday School class asked him to "tell us another story," William was inspired to write a six-verse song, titled "Tell Me the Stories of Jesus."

Healing Prayer Session

My prayer session was the day after what would have been my mom's 60th birthday. She's been gone about a year



and a half now and to say that I started the session overwhelmed with grief is an understatement. I know that Mom is in Heaven, perfectly whole, complete, and at peace, and yet, my feelings were anything but of completeness and peace. During the soaking prayer time I had a vision with Jesus. There were these burlap sacks that had "grief" written on them. I was moving them from my pile to Jesus' feet. There were so many of them; it was almost uncountable, to which Jesus explained that there is so much grief because there was so much love. There also was a different bag that said jealousy. I asked Jesus about it, but He didn't answer. Eventually Jesus stopped me, held me close and said, "that's enough for today." I wanted to keep going, I like to finish what I start, but instead Jesus took me to the edge of a cliff. He told me to look out in front of me. The landscape was so vast-- there were mountains and valleys, and towns and plains-- He said, "this is what I have for you. This is yours; you just need to

look up." We went back to where the bags of grief were and as I stood in His arms, I watched them slowly disappear. I knew, even though He didn't say it, that Jesus was taking them for me.

In Acts 8 there is a story about how Philip's trust and obedience to Holy Spirit led him to walk beside the Eunuch's carriage and share about Jesus. I realized Jesus was asking me to have that same trust-- through releasing the bags of grief, looking upward and outward from the cliff, and the lack of answer to the jealousy bag. I know that if I can let go of what I so tightly grasp and look up, Jesus has great things planned for me. I left the prayer session feeling many things-freer without all of those bags of grief, hopeful in the future Jesus has for me, and a yearning to allow my trust in Him to continue to grow so that I too can be His good and faithful servant.
