### A Message from the Executive Director

The love of a mother can give us a glimpse of what God is like. Mother-figures also play a part in molding and filling our souls; teachers who nurture, neighbors who give hugs and cookies, friends who act as spiritual guides. I'm so sorry. *May the Lord give you all the things I was unable or unwilling to give you. May the Lord guide you in ways I never could and grant you peace. May the Lord free you from any of my grief, fear, and anger. May the Lord free you from expectations you are still trying to live up to.*

*I pray that God will help you to see that the hurt and pain I caused you came from my own childhood. It limited me, and I am so sorry if it has limited you. I pray that God will remove from you any belief that you were not wanted or loved. I want you to keep all of the good that came from me and give the rest to God.*

*My precious one, I love you. I am so proud of you. I am so glad you were born. Be released now to be the person that God created you to be. Be free, my love, and live!*
