And when someone challenged me as to whether I would accept an emergency shelter in my neighborhood, and welcome it, I gulped. Itâ€ [™] s natural enough that fears of unknown people pop up. But as I thought about it more, and realized that I have no control over who lives next door to me in my suburban neighborhood, at any time; and as I learned more about who comprises the population of homeless people, I became a strong advocate for the Penn Daw/Beacon Hill location. I WOULD welcome it in my neighborhood. And a little bit after that, I became sad that I had not understood what people in the current shelter are enduring in terms of living conditions. How can anyone find a personal sense of being centered, to overcome the challenges that placed them alone and in a shelter, in crowded, sewage smelling tiny rooms, far away from the rest of the population? It is long past time that we as a community face our responsibility to the most vulnerable, with compassion and our company. Fairfax is one of the riches counties in the US; surely we can do better, and set a model for care, supportive housing, and respecting the inherent worth and dignity of every human.
