Mykelti is celebrating her 5th birthday this month cancer free after a 15 month battle with Stage IV/V Bilateral Diffuse Anaplastic Wilms Tumor (kidney cancer)! Her journey started in Australia where her dad was stationed with the US Navy. After spending 6 weeks receiving chemotherapy in Adelaide, South Australia (a 6 hour plane ride away from her home in Darwin, Northern Territory), Mykelti and her mom made the long trip back to the US to seek treatment at St. Jude in Memphis, Tennessee. Her dad and brother followed six weeks later, just in time for her surgery where they removed her entire left kidney and 20% of her right kidney. She underwent 13 rounds of radiation and received 17 chemotherapy cycles. Her favorite statistic to tell everyone is that she received 112 doses of chemo. Now, two months since her last doses of chemo, she is playing baseball, making up for lost time with her brother, exploring her new home in Gulfport, MS, and patiently waiting for her dad to return home from deployment late this summer. She is excited to get back into ballet, gymnastics, and swimming, and can't wait to try the piano! We're all super thankful for St. Jude and to Jacy's Wagons for making our days easier while in treatment! We were able to pass on our wagon to a family in Mykelti's clinic who wouldn't otherwise have the means to purchase a wagon. We hope it brings their family as much joy and peace of mind as it did for us during those long weeks and months! We're excited to be on the 'other side' of treatment and we hope to read more success stories from all of the Jacy's Wagons families!
