

# **CANNABIS VICTORY CHALLENGE COINS**

## **DIRECTIONS FOR USE**

**CONGRATULATIONS!** You are now in possession of an official Cannabis Victory Challenge Coin commemorating the end of Federal Marijuana Prohibition (1970-2025).

**IMPORTANT:** Please read all directions before use.

## **STEP 1: IDENTIFICATION**

Locate your coin type:

- **NvA GOLD:** For individuals who do not consume cannabis but support freedom
- **NvC SILVER:** For consumers celebrating the victory
- **NvS BRONZE:** For suppliers navigating the ongoing chaos

If you are uncertain which coin you received, consult your own life choices. If still uncertain, flip coin. Heads = you care about freedom. Tails = you care about freedom. (See? They're the same.)

## **STEP 2: DISPLAY**

**PROPER DISPLAY LOCATIONS:** ✓ Desk where you work (if not a federal employee)

- ✓ Shelf next to participation trophies from things that actually ended
- ✓ Wallet, as reminder that victory is complicated
- ✓ Anywhere West Virginia's \$34 million isn't being spent

**IMPROPER DISPLAY LOCATIONS:** ✗ As proof of federal job eligibility

- ✗ As substitute for gun permit (medical patients still can't have both)
- ✗ At ferry operator job interview (they'll drug test you anyway)
- ✗ In lieu of banking services for cannabis businesses

## **STEP 3: WHEN TO REFERENCE YOUR COIN**

## USE YOUR COIN WHEN:

- Someone claims prohibition ended cleanly
- Politicians argue for imaginary rehab costs while ignoring \$90M/month in potential Hawaii revenue
- Federal employees get fired for state-legal activity
- Anyone asks "Isn't it legal now?"
- The Chicago Bulls are selling THC drinks but your cousin lost his job over it
- You need to explain the difference between "legal" and "sort of legal" depending on which laws we're enforcing today"

## PROPER USAGE EXAMPLE:

Friend: "Wait, I thought weed was legal now?"

You: *produce coin* "Let me explain something..."

## STEP 4: PHILOSOPHICAL INTEGRATION

Your coin represents a knowing agent persisting through contradictory times. You are witnessing the messy transition between prohibition and freedom. This is cosmic function, not just coin ownership.

## REMEMBER:

- You are a knowing agent
- These coins document what actually happened versus what we're told happened
