"Hello Marines and Associates,"

For the last few weeks, I've been reflecting on a concept that's easy to define, but far more difficult to live out day to day: Integrity.

Many of us still carry the words of our drill instructors etched into our minds: "A Marine never lies, cheats, or steals." Those words weren't simply meant to make us look good in front of others—they were meant to shape us into something more. To serve as the moral compass that would guide us when rules faded, when orders conflicted, and when character was all we had left.

Integrity is not about perfection—it's about accountability. It's about owning up to your mistakes and learning from them. It's about making the right call even when it costs you something—popularity, comfort, convenience, or even your career. And it's especially about staying true to your values when no one's around to applaud you for it.



In uniform, integrity can mean the difference between life and death, success and failure, unity and chaos. It shows in the decisions we make on the battlefield, in the barracks, and even in a simple handshake deal. Marines with integrity don't just follow rules; they honor them—because rules are built on generations of sacrifice, discipline, and unshakable commitment to something greater than self.

But here's the hard truth: Integrity doesn't retire. It doesn't get put away with the uniform. Whether you're still on active duty, serving in a different capacity, or have moved on to civilian life, the expectations don't change. If anything, the world needs that example of Marine integrity now more than ever—in business, in family, in leadership, in friendship.

It's easy to say "Semper Fi"—but do we live it?

When you speak, do your words carry the weight of truth?

When you act, do you do so with respect and fairness, even when it's not returned?

When you lead, do you do it with the courage to make unpopular decisions for the right reasons?

These are the questions I've been asking myself lately. I don't have all the answers—but I do believe that integrity is like muscle. It must be exercised, tested, and strengthened over time. And like any virtue, it's most visible when it's most inconvenient.

To those still serving: hold the line. Uphold the standards, even when others start to drift. Be the example others quietly follow.

To those of us now serving in different roles, outside of the Corps: don't let the values we lived by fade. Bring that same honor, that same discipline, and that same accountability into every space you occupy.

Because ultimately, titles fade. Ranks change. But character? That lasts!














We often take for granted the presence and reliability of people whom we always see and can always be counted on when work (no matter the day, the weather, or the type) must be done. We think we know everything about them, but do we really? To honor such a person, the Scuttlebutt spotlights and thanks Marine Ron MacCubbin for his many years of dedicated service to the Marine Corps League and Detachment 1081.

Ron is a charter member of the Corporal Mason O. Yarbrough Detachment 1081. From its founding in 2001 until 2005, Ron did double duty, serving as the detachment's second Commandant and as commander of the Honor Guard. Detachment 1081 has been a huge success since its charter, in large part due to Ron's diligence, professionalism and true desire and passion to help people. Those traits defined his professional career as well as his career in the League. As Honor Guard commander from 2001-2005, Ron made it his business to support every veteran funeral that the detachment was requested to support. As a result, he spearheaded over 1,000 funerals, spanning the eight-county bootheel area of CG, Bollinger, Scott, Mississippi, Stoddard, New Madrid, Pemiscot and Dunklin Counties. The professional way in

which he trained the team and executed events laid the blueprint for how the Honor Guard is led to this day. It also boosted the stature and reputation of the detachment, which has facilitated the detachment's overall mission in support of veterans and the community.

Ron's professional career necessitated an extended hiatus from active involvement in the league, but he returned to full participation in 2020. In 2023, Ron volunteered to reprise his former role as leader of the Honor Guard. In this second tour as Commander, he continued the success pattern he had previously laid while making improvements to how the Honor Guard was perceived by the public. He inventoried all Honor Guard uniforms, replaced less serviceable gear with new, and created staunch uniformity. Each member of the Guard now looks precisely the same, and the Guard is now instantly recognizable in and warmly received by the public thanks to Ron's insistence on uniformity. And as before, he insisted that each veteran receive the military funeral rites they earned. Unless there was no recourse, Ron found a way to service every funeral request, averse to turning down even one. Additionally, he trained each member of the Honor Guard to act as Commander of the Guard in emergency situations. This insistence provided tremendous flexibility and contributed greatly to the unmatched 1,600+ veteran funerals that Ron oversaw between his first and second tenure as Honor Guard leader, spanning 10+ Bootheel counties.

In addition to veteran funerals, the Honor Guard under Ron's command participated in countless other community events and activities, including flag ceremonies, parades, ribbon cuttings, community ceremonies, and Patriot, Memorial and Veterans Day events. Highlighting Ron's versatility and flexibility, it was not unusual for the Honor Guard to participate in multiple different events on Veterans or Memorial Day, and sometimes on very short notice.

Within the detachment, Ron routinely volunteered to participate in detachment activities. It was very rare to not see Ron at a Detachment sponsored or supported event, whether helping other League members, non-League veterans, or assisting fundraising efforts at community fairs and other events.

Hailing from the great state of New York, Ron has a very interesting background that few are aware of. At one point in his career, Ron worked as a private investigator, perhaps sharing many thrilling cases with a famous private investigator named Thomas Sullivan Magnum, but that would be total speculation. Another interesting factoid is that Ron is one of the very few Marines in Marine Corps history to have never worked in his MOS. That's right! Ron was trained as a jet engine mechanic, assigned to aviation units to make airplanes fly but worked in S-1 Admin. On day one, he was hijacked at his initial fleet unit and stashed in Admin billets for his entire 12-year active-duty career. The Maintenance Chief was rightly angry to discover one of his aircraft mechanics repairing grammar on the old man's memos or letters to the editor.



Ron has now handed the reigns of Honor Guard leadership to Marine Steve Seyller, and we collectively say thank you to him for his many years of faithful and dedicated service to the Marines and families of Detachment 1081 and to the community he calls home.
