









































## Scuttlebutt Editor: Mitch Cassell

This month, we shine a spotlight on a young man who demonstrated exemplary personal character and service consistent with the Marine Corps values of Honor Courage and Commitment. On January 5, 2025, A MCL Chapter 1081 member's home was severely damaged when a winter ice storm collapsed a tree onto his home, severely damaging the roof and rendering it uninhabitable for six months. When the call went out to fellow veterans to assist a Marine in distress, Spencer Holland also heeded the call and rushed to the scene with his Marine dad.



Suffering cold winter temperatures, Spencer worked tirelessly to help to remove the fallen tree and install tarps on the roof to limit further damage from direct exposure to winter weather conditions.

Spencer's selfless action was a testament to his upbringing and reflected great credit upon him, his family, and MCL Detachment 1080; and were in keeping with the highest traditions of the Marine Corps and the United States Naval Service. In recognition of his dedication to service, on 13 June 2025, the Commandant of the
