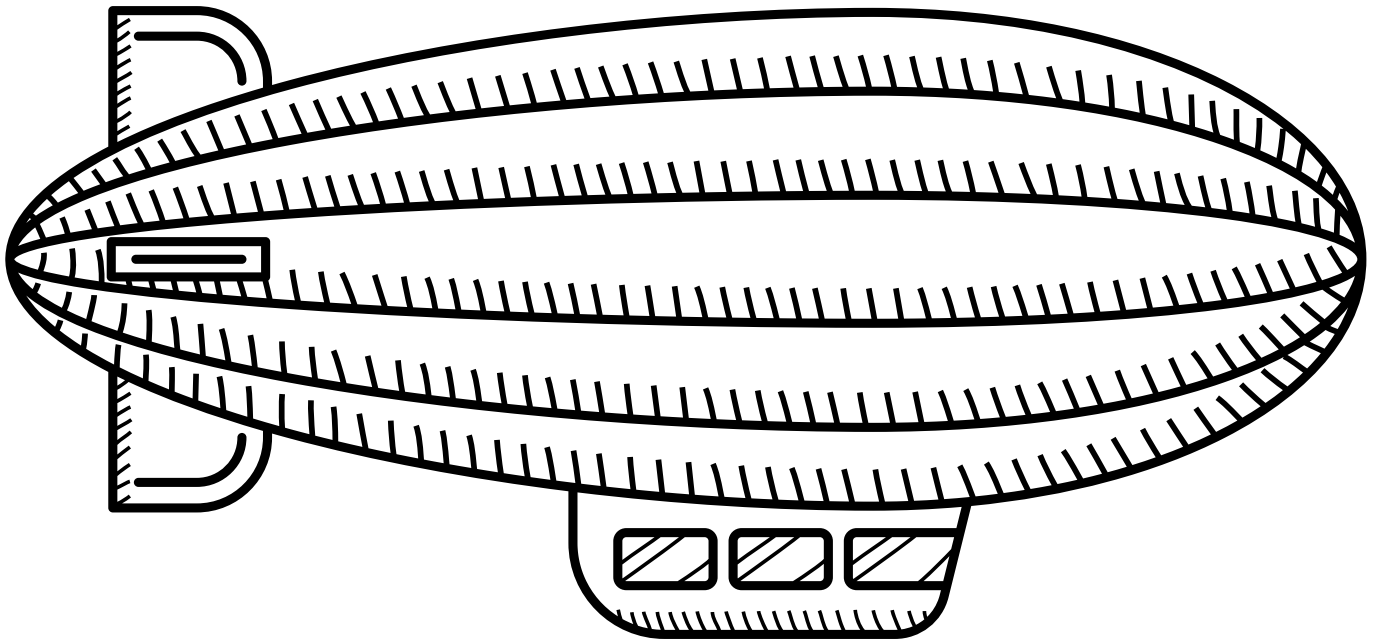


Aa is for airplane



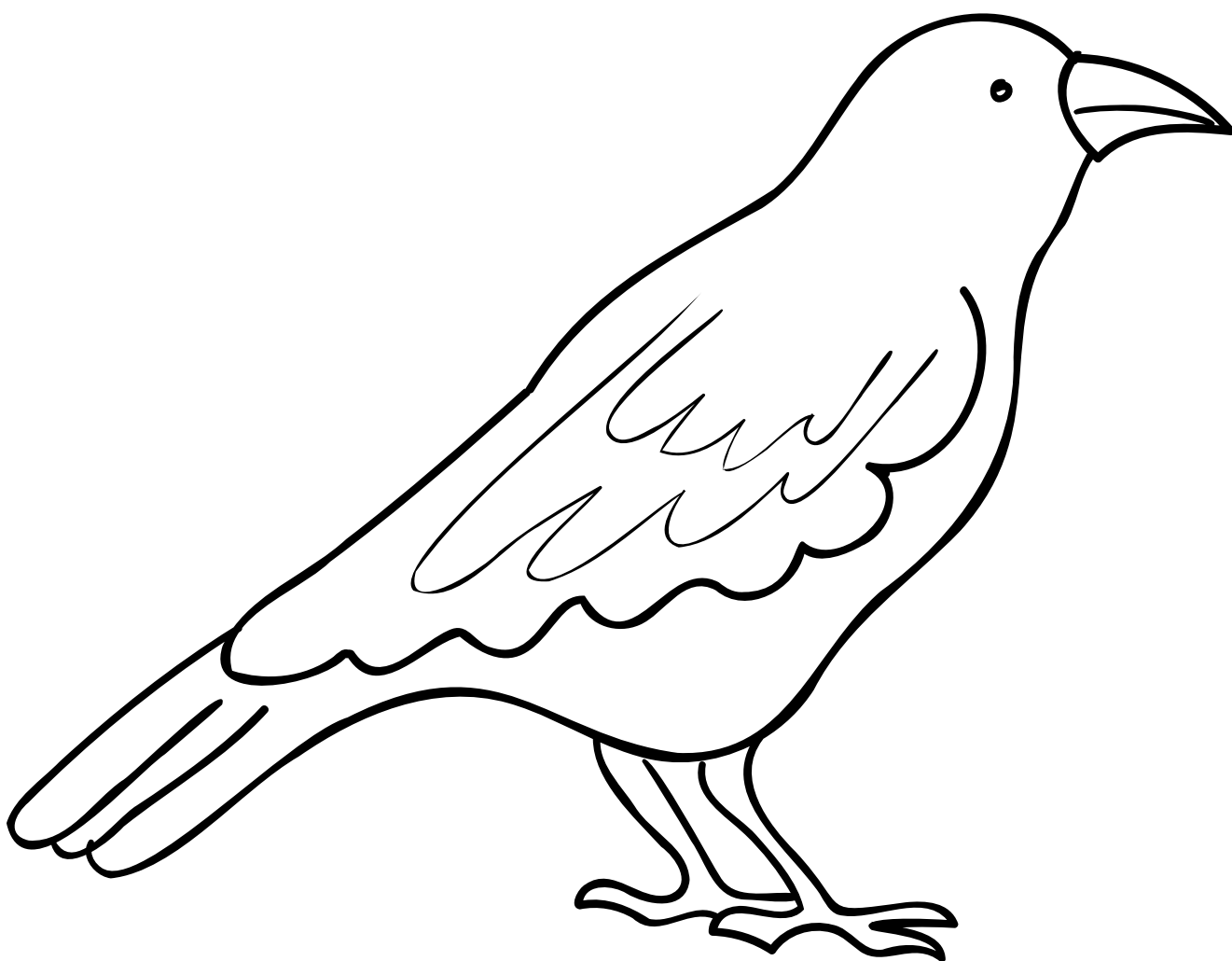
the first successful powered airplane was created in 1903 by

Bb is for blimp



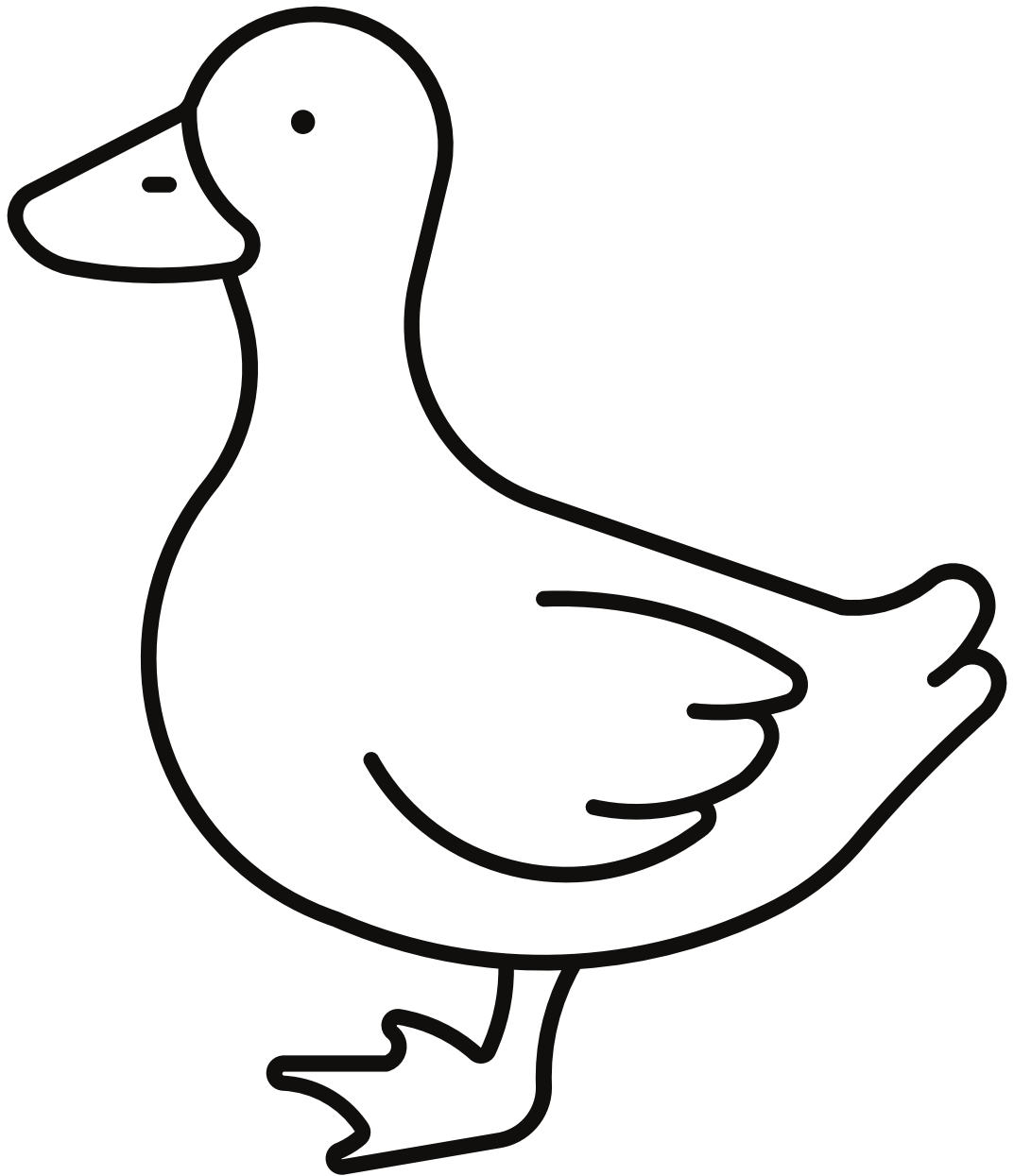
Blimps were first used in the mid-1800s. Blimps can fly due to high pressure and helium pumped into the balloon.

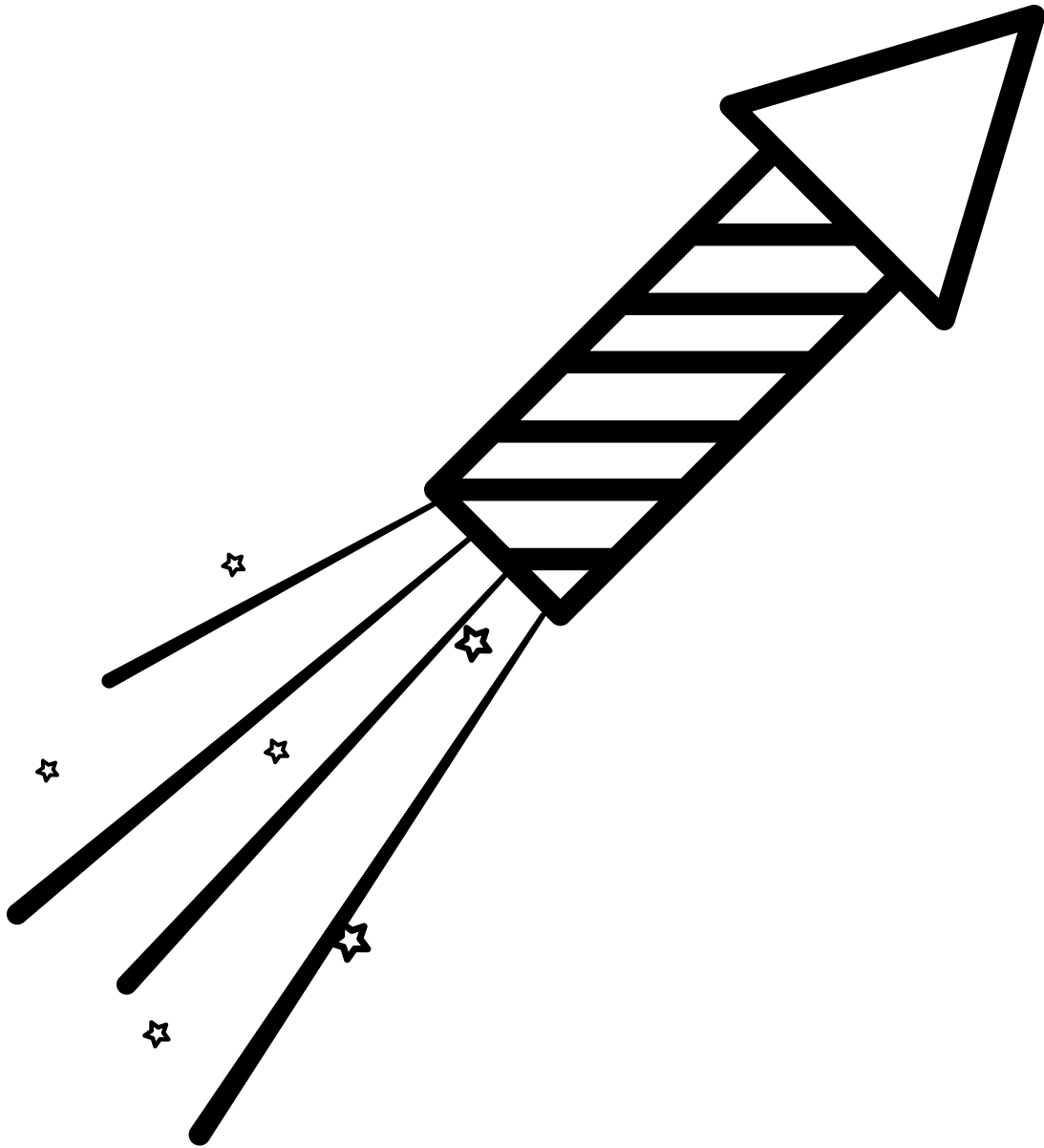

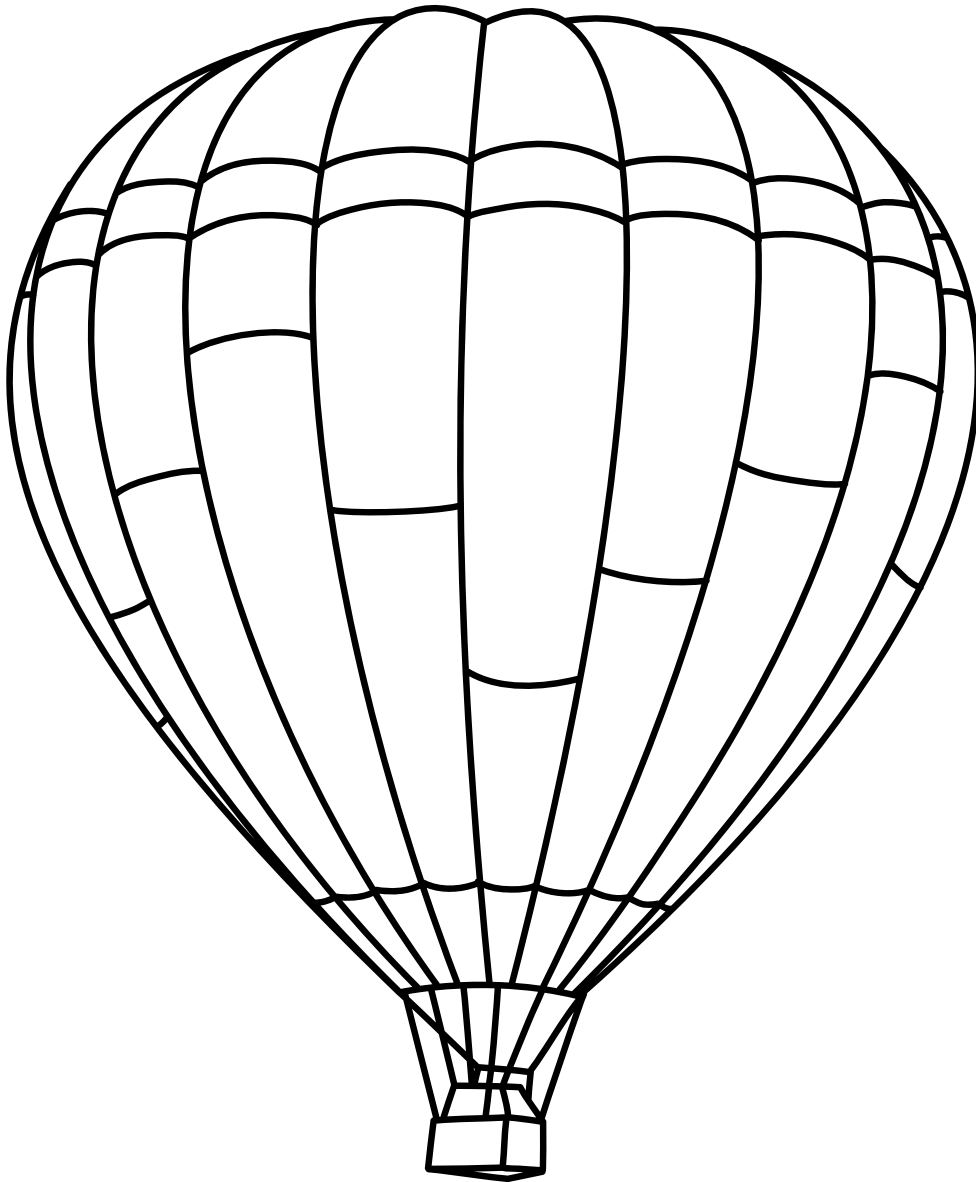
Fireworks originated in China around 2,000 years ago. In the beginning, fireworks were only orange and white.

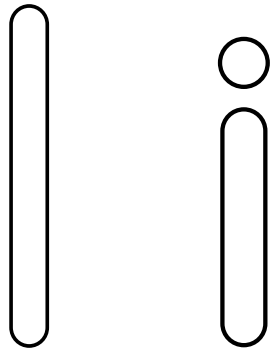


A glider can soar through the air without the help of a motor. They use currents of rising air called thermals and other weather phenomena to stay in the air.

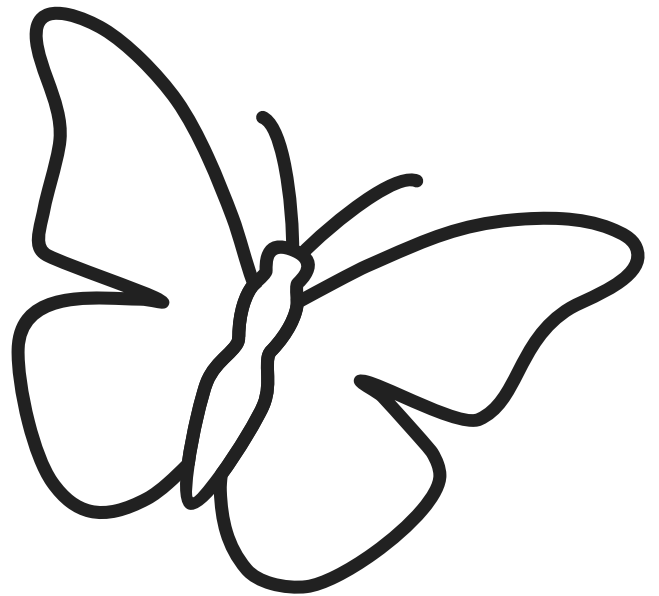
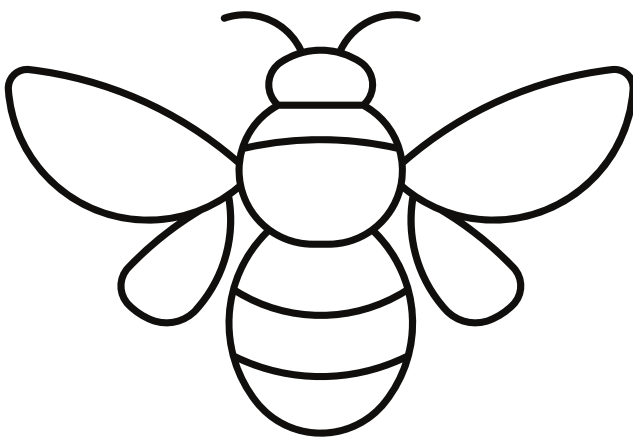
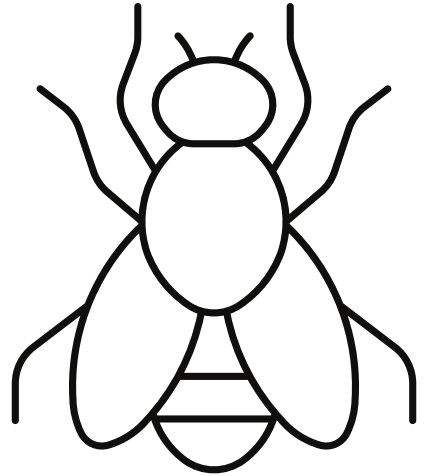
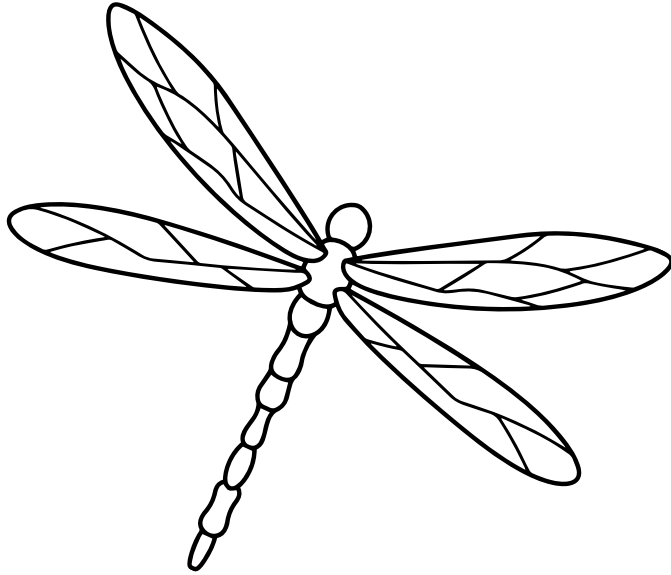

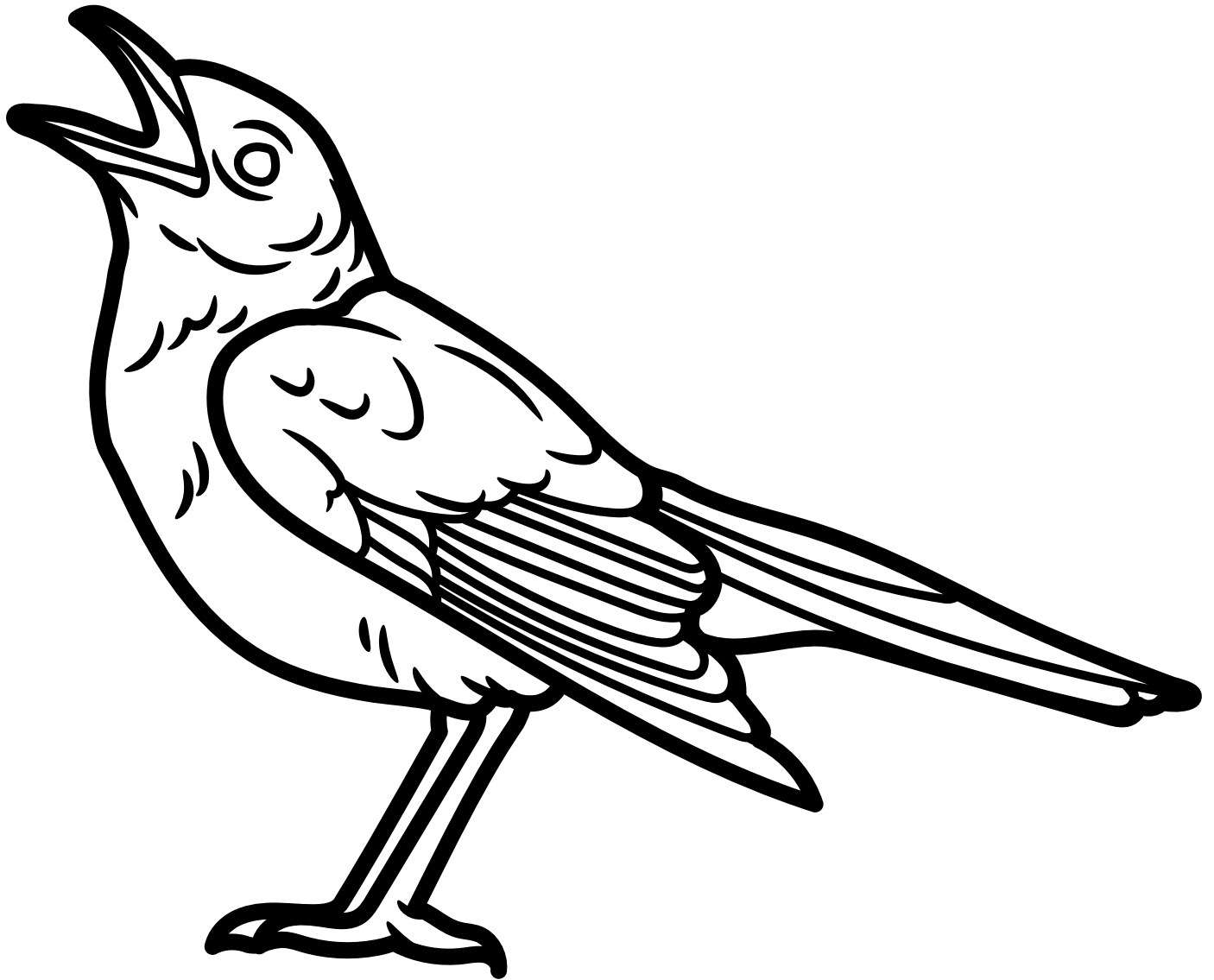
the L-29 Delfin is a 2-seat subsonic jet aircraft, used as a basic, intermediate and weapons training aircraft.

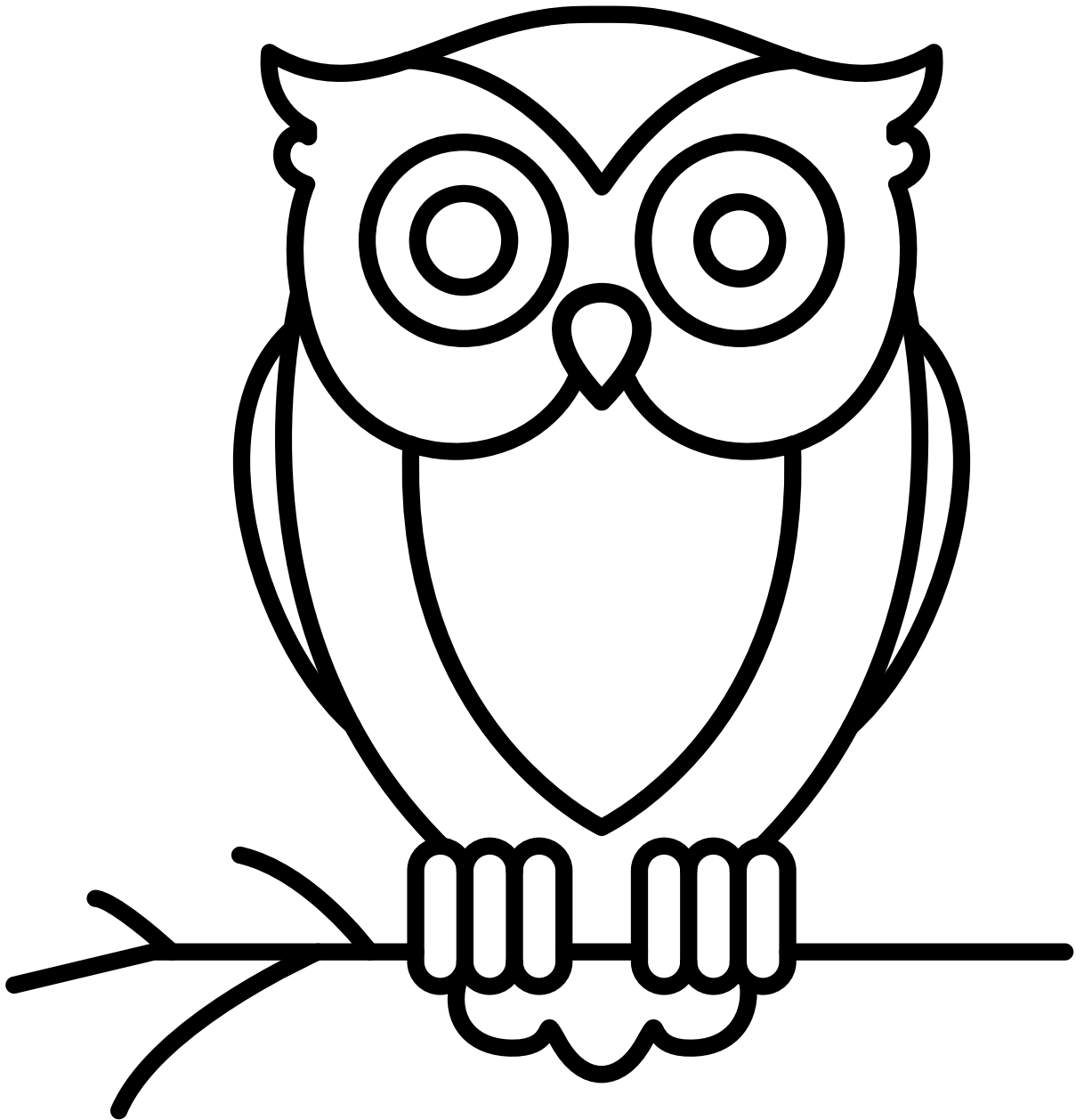
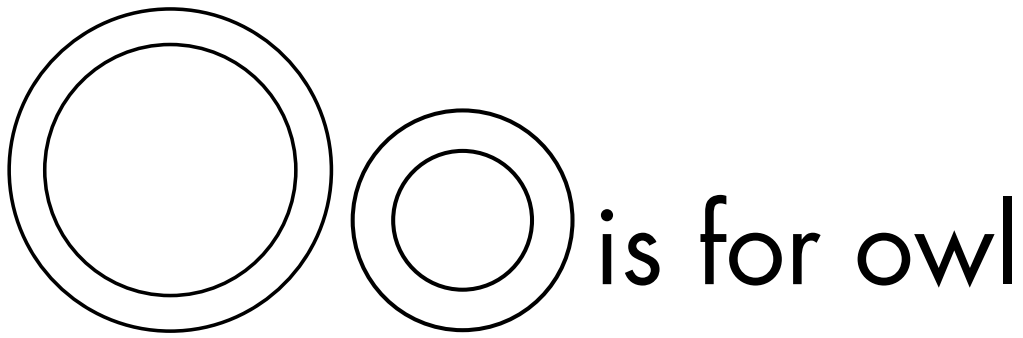

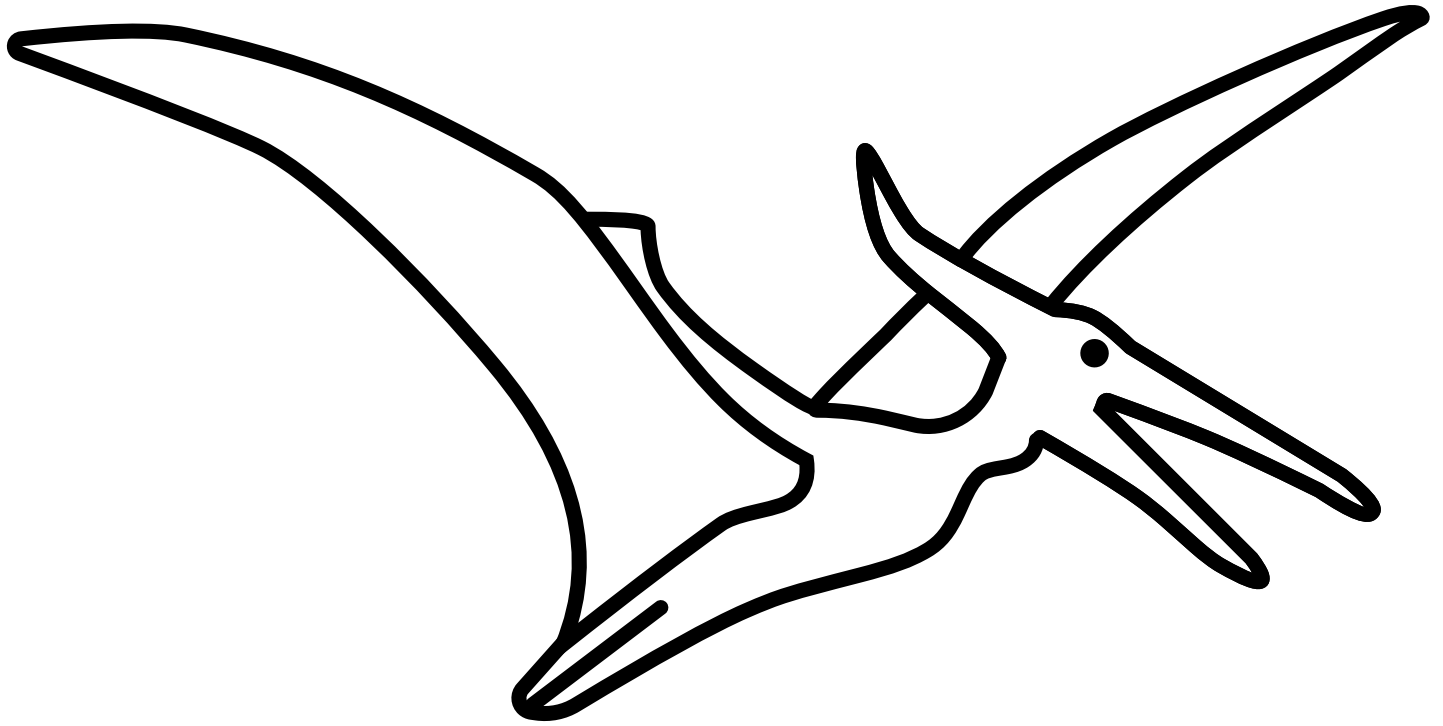


Nightingales got their name because they sing at night. Only unpaired males sing regularly at night.



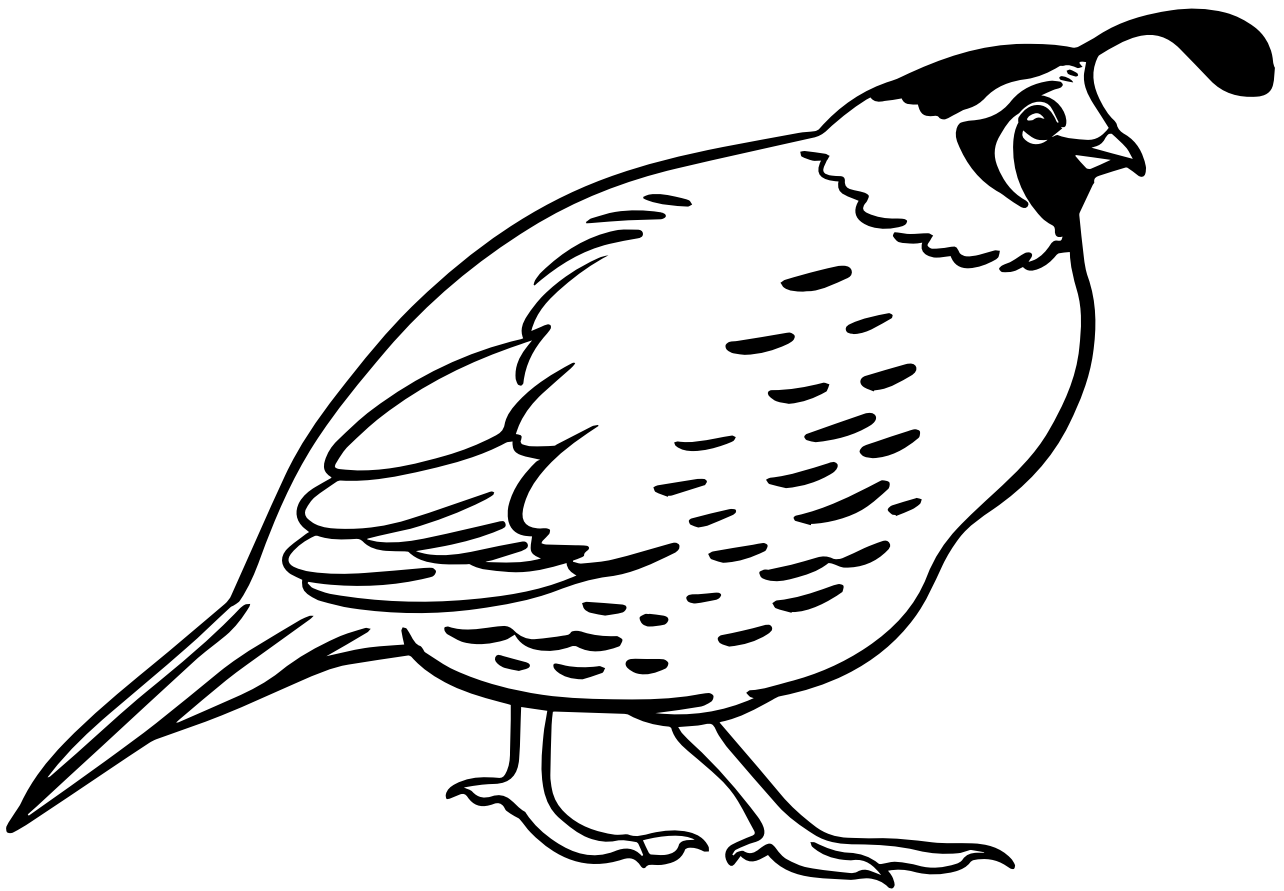

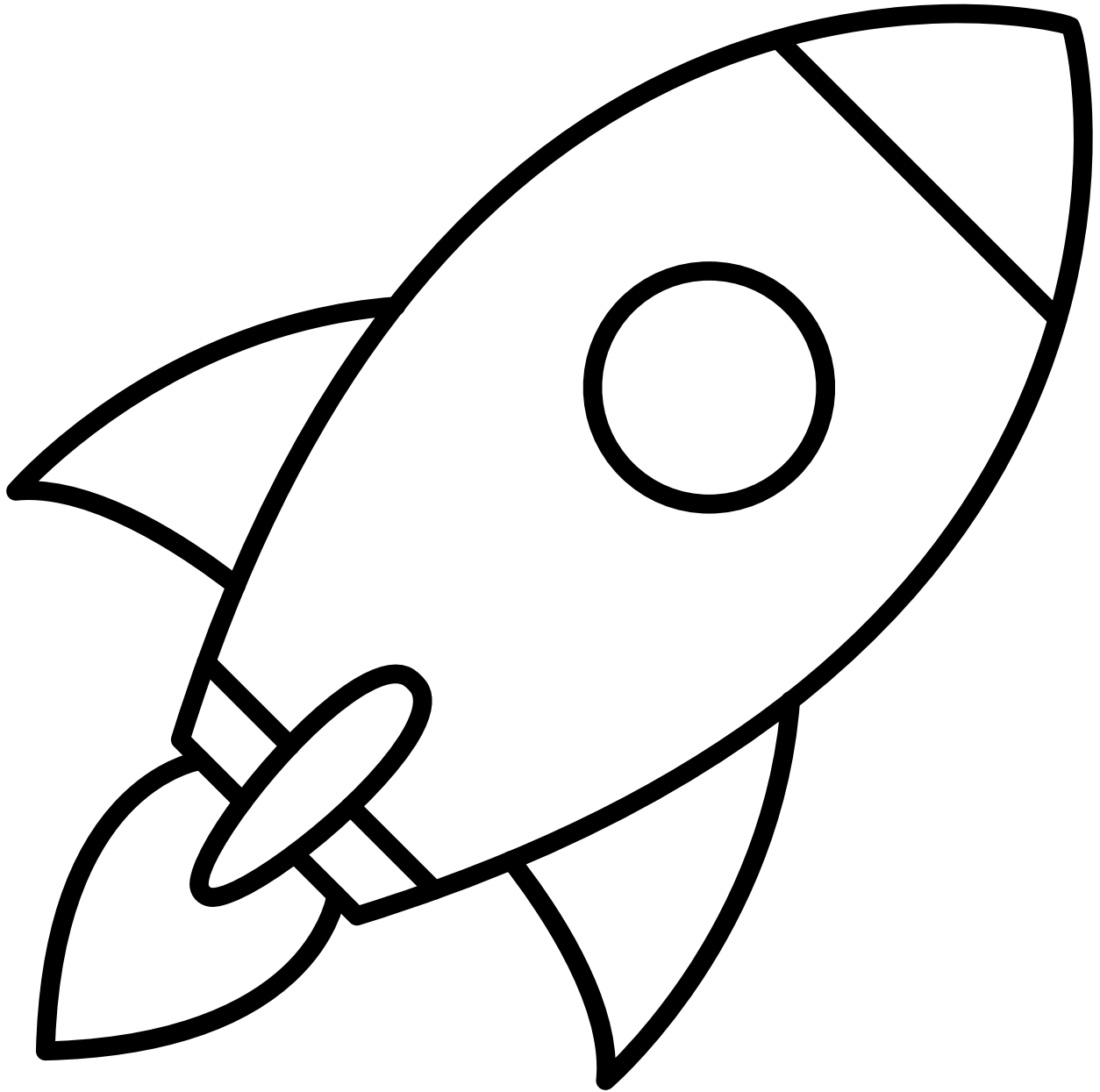
Pterodactyls were prehistoric flying reptiles that lived about 145 to 65.5 million years ago at the same time as the dinosaurs.

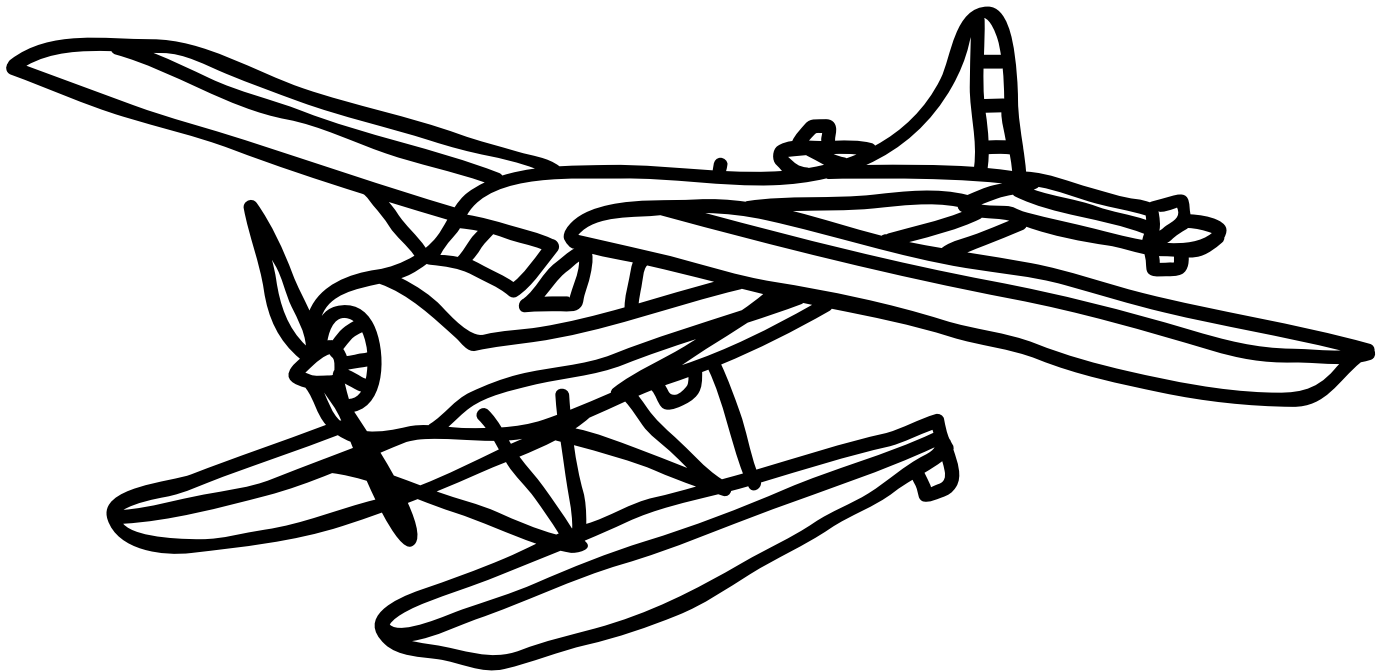
Quails nest on the ground and live in flocks during the winter. They can fly at 40 mph (64 kph).

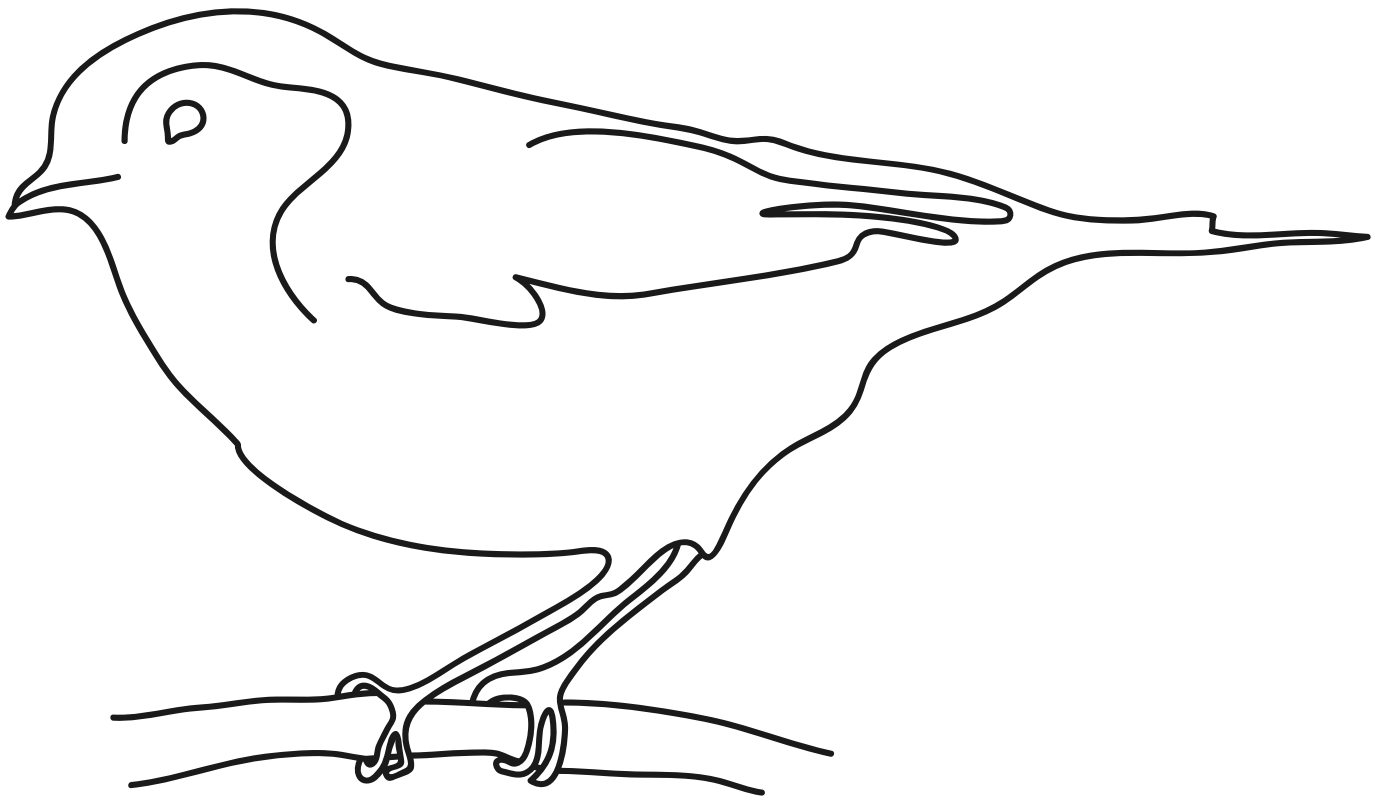


A seaplane can land, float and take off on water. The first seaplanes were built in 1911.
