

Options for Paw Traction on Slick Floors

1. **Pawz Booties**- Lightweight rubber booties

Pros: usually well tolerated, no mess, work well, can be left on most of the day (check for irritation or swelling), can be worn outside, cheap, provide some nail protection if needed, effective, safe for floors

Cons: will wear through quickly if you dog drags their nails at all, some dogs don't like booties



2. **Gripper Dog Socks**- sock with wrap around traction/rubber

Pros: easy to put on, lightweight, no mess, can be left on most of the day, can be worn outside, cheap, sturdier if dog drags nails, provide nail protection if needed, effective, safe for floors

Cons: may need to add Velcro or tape strap to keep on, some dogs don't like booties



3. **Toegrips**-thick bands of rubber that go around the nails

Pros: well tolerated, can last for a long time, no mess, safe for floors

Cons: difficult to size correctly, difficult to place correctly, don't work for all dogs depending on nail length, can wear down if dog drags feet, will fall off if sized incorrectly



4. **Adhesive Paw Pads**- adhesive rubber pads, several brands

Pros: easy to put on, well tolerated, cheap, effective while they stay on

Cons: Can fall off very quickly, fall off quicker if dog is outside a lot
