We the people are all so deeply unaware of the ugly roots of racism that plague America as a nation. I did not say Americans, although there is an embarrassing amount of people who still believe in the archaic belief that superiority is based on skin color. In society, there is only one race, and that is the human race. If there is one thing I want you to take away from reading this is that it is not enough to be not racist, you must be anti-racist. You must hold your friends accountable, hold your family accountable, hold yourself accountable, but most importantly you must hold our authorities accountable. Attend protest, make your voice heard and if you are white, weaponize your privilege to help further better society.

1865, the 13th amendment is passed stating that neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction. In short, you are free unless you're a criminal. The best way to legally keep African Americans as slaves is by criminalizing them. This term has been coined mass incarceration and the statistics show it. The U.S holds 25% of the world's prison population but only holds 5% of the world's population. Additionally, 34% of the U.S prison population is African American, so one in three African American men have the chance to go to jail, and it's one in seventeen for white men. According to these statistics, African Americans are incarcerated at more than five times the rate of white men.

Much of what is being broadcasted is just a dumbed-down and less genuine version of the sheer complexity of racism and what's happening and I feel that is a disservice to the end-user.
