The Georgia Foundation for Physical Therapy (GFPT) and the family of Phyllis Duncan Palma PT, DPT, ATP/SMS are establishing a scholarship in her memory. Tragically, Phyllis lost her life after being struck by an auto when walking home from dinner with a friend on September 19, 2019.

Phyllis was a long time, dedicated member of the APTA and PTAG. An accomplished physical therapist, she loved children, aquatic therapy and serving those living with spinal cord and, brain injury. She made an impact at Children's Healthcare of Atlanta on the Comprehensive Inpatient Rehabilitation Unit, Acute Care Rehabilitation Services, Day Rehab Program, the Center for Advanced Technology and Robotics and most recently in the Seating and Mobility Center. Phyllis also played an integral role in the development of the Pediatric Spinal Cord Injury Program and design of the aquatic therapy pool. She excelled in aquatic therapy and as a result, received the leadership award from the American Physical Therapy Association Aquatics Section in 2017. Phyllis had an entrepreneurial spirit, founding two companies that provided pediatric aquatic rehabilitation services. Phyllis was extremely passionate about the physical therapy profession and helping others. Her dedication to her patients was remarkable, always serving as a steadfast advocate.


