

Pastor's Meditation

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Every Lent we are faced with the temptation to believe that we can make it alone without Jesus or that we are self-sufficient and are doing just fine on our own. Then things happen—things that we have no control over and all of a sudden we are immediately cognizant of the fact that we do need Jesus more than we know. I think the real temptation is the line of thinking that we only need prayer during our times of need. Why is this? Why do we think like this? Why do we not have good prayer practice when things are going well? Do we only think that Jesus is available when something goes terribly wrong or when things are not right? The temptation is we feel as if we are somehow in control. The truth of the matter is that we are not—we are not.

Jesus used prayer in His own times of temptation and also encouraged His disciples to do the same. There is a direct link between prayer and temptation. Prayer helps keep us from falling into temptation. Jesus found this connection so important that He included it as one of the petitions of the Lord's Prayer— "lead us not into temptation." He encouraged His disciples to pray that they not be tempted.

Being in the Word is another strong tool that we can use to keep us from falling victim to Satan's temptations. Notice here that Satan cannot make you sin—you sin of your own accord when you choose to fall victim to a temptation. Satan can only tempt you. So the old line, "The devil made me do it" has no merit or credibility. However, it is our human nature to always place the blame on somebody or something because it has been happening that way from the very beginning of creation.

If you want to be strong and have the ability to resist temptation, then simply be in (Continued on page 2)

the places God promises to be—in His Word and in His Sacraments and in prayer. There you will find the strength to withstand all the evil temptations that Satan will throw your way.

The biggest temptation is the temptation to believe that you don't need to go to church, you don't need to hear the Word, you don't need to receive the Sacraments regularly, and that you don't need your brothers and sisters in Christ, all because you have "Jesus in your heart." If you remain disconnected from the vine of God's love, the nourishment of His Word and Sacraments, and the fellowship of God's people, you will eventually die spiritually.

Many Christians think that they can be away from the Means of God's Grace and still thrive and survive. You may be okay and appear fine for a while, but eventually if you remain away too long, you will die spiritually.

Jesus said, "I am the Vine, you are the branches. If a man remains in Me and I in him, he will bear much fruit. Apart from Me you can do <u>nothing</u>." What Jesus is saying here is that we need Him very much. We need Him to keep us from falling into temptation. We need Him to help us from becoming self-sufficient. We need Him because He has been tempted in every way that we are, yet He was without sin. He can help us in our time of need.


It has been said that when person is dying of hypothermia (or when they are freezing to death) that they don't want to wake up when trying to be revived. They don't want to wake up because they say when you're dying of hypothermia it feels so good.

People who have grown so cold from inactivity, and who haven't been in the warmth of God's Word and in the fire of His Sacraments, most likely feel so good about what they are doing, that they don't want to be awaken from their impending spiritual death. Please don't let this happen. Listen to the wake-up calls that God may be sending your way. Come back and join together with your brothers and sisters in Christ who are going through many of the same things you are going through, and who understand and can help you in your own time of temptation and need. Use the tools that Jesus has made available for you—His Word, Sacraments, and prayer. After all, if Jesus used them—they must be awesome!

Join me this Lenten season to fan into flame the power of the Gospel in your life and let us grow together in our faith in Christ. To Him be the glory forever! Amen!




Easter Breakfast April 4, 2021









On Sunday, February 21, 2021, we celebrated the Baptism of Joyce Gayle Townes, child of Richard and Kyle Townes.




church office and let Lisa know and she will put you on the list. We look forward to seeing y'all there!

Newsletter article – March 2021

Hudson Taylor, a Nineteenth Century British missionary to China, is reported to have said, "God's work, done in God's way, will not lack God's supply." To know God's way, we need to know His Holy Word. Or to say it another way: you need to know your Bible.

St. Paul, before he spends two chapters on giving, wrote that every thought is to be taken captive to the obedience of Christ (2 Cor 10:5). Doctrine matters. And doctrine matters because the Scriptures matter. And the Scriptures matter because this is where we learn the teaching of Christ. Our thoughts must be brought into line with the teaching of Scripture so that our work is what God wants done and so that we do this work in His way.

A good tree bears good fruit. A bad tree bears bad fruit. We have been made good trees in holy baptism. We are fertilized and pruned for bearing good fruit by constantly hearing God's Word preached and taught in sermon and Bible Class and in receiving the life-giving, faith-sustaining food of the Lord's Supper. Remember your doctrine, hold on to the Lord's teaching, and your thoughts will be taken captive to the obedience of Christ.

Bringing every thought captive to the obedience of Christ is recognizing that God does provide. The Lord's Prayer teaches us to pray for daily bread. Praying this day in and day out reminds us that the Lord is the giver of our daily bread, and that we are to gives thanks for His daily provision of it. God is rarely early and never late in His work, as Abraham learned on the mount of the Lord it will be provided. The Lord's generosity forms our generosity in return.

Thus, we set aside for the work of God a generous, first-fruits, proportion of the daily bread that God has given to us. This act of trust in the Lord's provision is the working out of our faith in Him. When budgetary discussions pop up, our natural reaction is to point fingers. But remember your doctrine, and what your mother taught about pointing fingers. Our first natural reaction is not always right. In fact, when our thoughts are brought into captivity of Christ, our first reaction should be repentance. It should raise questions in our own lives. As good trees in Christ who are to bear good fruit, we should ask whether our thoughts have been taken captive by obedience to Christ. Have we given generously? Have we given our first-fruits? You know. And God knows. "For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to show Himself strong on behalf of those whose heart is loyal to Him" (2 Chron 16:9).

God will provide. He always has and He always will. He gives His meat in due season. He has not left you as orphans but has grafted you into His own family. You belong to Him. Remember this, letting this thought dwell in you richly. And you will then be rich toward others. (https://blogs.lcms.org/2021)




