

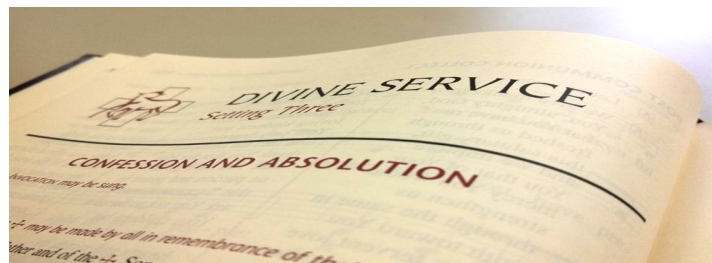

Dear Friends at St. Paul,

In Jesus Christ, God overcame sin, death, and the devil for us. Our thanksgiving flows from forgiven hearts, “Oh, give thanks unto the Lord, for He is good. For His mercy endures forever.”

Sight unseen—in Christ—we are thankful against all odds and discouragement. If the Lord is on our side, why should we be discouraged?

With joyous attitude and prayerful posture, God’s faith-formed-folk are told to “give thanks in all circumstances.” No circumstance in life is an excuse for not being thankful. Despite our backsliding, our pride, our cowardice, and our rebellion, God remains constant in mercy. That is why we thank God. His goodness to us is His unceasing mercy. Job knew that. His heart, while broken at the loss of His children and possessions, rested thankfully in God’s safekeeping, “The Lord giveth and the Lord taketh away; blessed be the name of the Lord”(Job1:21).

To “Give thanks in all circumstances” is to grasp the idea that all things happen for the Christian’s good. Paul said it well, “And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose. What then shall we say? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare His own Son, but gave Him up for us all—how will He not also, along with Him, graciously give us all things?” (Rom. 3:28, 31-32).

In light of this, I am thankful for many things. I am thankful first of all for my Lord Jesus Christ. I am thankful for my wonderful wife and our boys and their wives and our little grandson and our grandbaby on the way! I am thankful that the Lord called me to be His servant of the Word. I am thankful that I have a very special congregation who recognizes that the “God who is able” will continue to provide for all our needs of body and soul. Jesus will never abandon us but will watch over us and keep us in His loving arms forever, and in that thought, I know that this church will be here for many, many years to come! If that’s not something to be thankful for, I don’t know what is. Please take time this Thanksgiving to share with each other those things for which you, too, are thankful. 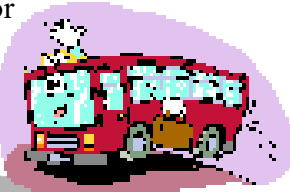


The Children’s Christmas Program rehearsal practice will begin on Sunday, November 28, during Sunday School.



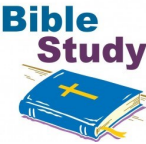
Parents, please come to the beginning of this first practice/meeting and we will determine best times for rehearsals. The Children’s program includes children and Jr. High and High School.

Religious Education
