

Pastor's Meditation

"We also triumph in our tribulations, knowing that tribulation brings about perseverance" (Romans 5:3).

Greetings in Jesus friends in Christ!

Here we are again, back to newsletter production. Just another sign that things are settling down in life and things are slowly beginning to get back to a sense of normalcy. This will still be a slow process, but one that I think is headed in the right direction. Praise be to God... He does all things well!

Over the past six months, we've been through some very frustrating and discouraging times. We've had our faith tested, challenged, and tried. We've held steady...we've kept the faith. We've trusted in God even when things were out of our control and in the midst of helplessness. So, was the last six months a waste? No! I believe it made all of us stop and take inventory of the important things in life and turned our eyes to focus on Jesus and trust Him more; which is a GOOD THING!

This hasn't been easy, but the Christian life never is. The Christian life is a lesson in trusting God in the midst of cross bearing and difficulty. One of the terms for "tribulation" in the New Testament

refers to "pressure...like being crushed under a big boulder." This is a description of pain, of enduring strain. It's an illustration of the crush of our times. There's a certain kind of pressure that comes with unemployment. There's another kind of pressure that comes with the threat of losing your home. There's a pressure that comes from misfortune, or a rebellious child, or a runaway spouse, or with contracting COVID-19. All of life can be a series of crushing pressure and can leave us frustrated and discouraged.

Does God care about the pressures of life that we experience? If you were wondering, the answer would be a resounding, "Yes!" God does care. God knows about the number of hairs on your head. God knows when a sparrow falls to the ground. The Scriptures declare, "Indeed, the very hairs on your head are all numbered. Don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows" (Luke 12:7). Be assured of this: Jesus is a specialist in the things that worry you down inside. Jesus is a specialist in the trials and tribulations in life. Jesus is a specialist in temptation and the overcoming of such. Jesus knows that you can get through tomorrows troubles, and the troubles of the next day, and the next week, and the next year because He has overcome whatever may come our way. If you wonder how you're ever going to get "through this," remember who Jesus is. Jesus is the God of the impossible. Look to what He specializes in. He can take any situation that you've built into a mountain and can bore a tunnel through in a matter of seconds. Jesus says, "Bring it to Me...all of it...and I will give you rest." Don't get discouraged...trust in Jesus!

STEWARDSHIP

"Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might" (Eccl 9:10).

God bids us to be faithful in the tasks He calls us to do. He calls us to be members of a family (husbands and wives; fathers and mothers; sons and daughters). He calls us to be members of society (those who govern and those who are governed). And He calls us to be members of His family, the Church (those who preach and teach and those who hear and learn). Each of these callings from God places a duty on us.

As members of a family, husbands are given the duty to die for their wives as Christ gave His life for His bride, the Church; while wives are given the duty to respect their husbands and submit themselves to them as the Church does to Christ. Fathers and mothers are to raise their children in the fear and admonition of the Lord, teaching them the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Scriptures concerning Baptism, Confession, the Office of the Keys, and the Lord's Supper. Children are to honor their parents throughout their lives, and even when their parents are no longer alive, serving and obeying them, loving and cherishing them, and speaking well of them.

As members of society, God calls those who govern to bear the sword, that is, to punish those who do evil (those who live contrary to God's will) and to reward those who do good (those whose lives are lived in conformity with God's will). Those who are governed are to obey their leaders as to the Lord Himself, for their leaders bear the sword of God's temporal justice for a purpose.

As members of God's own family, the Church, He calls those who preach and teach to do so in faithfulness to His holy Word. To preach and teach the Law of God to convict the hearts of hearers of their sin and to encourage, admonish, and exhort them to do good works in accordance with God's will. They are to preach and teach the Gospel, the full forgiveness of their sins accomplished by Christ and received through faith, not by works. They are to administer the means of grace in accordance with the Gospel and the Word of God. They do all this for the young and old alike, for those who are near and far off. Those who hear and learn are to submit themselves to their preachers and teachers. They are support them by their prayers and their gifts.

Each of these callings from God place a duty on us. They make a claim on our presence; on our prayers; and our time, talents, and treasures. So, "Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might" (Eccl 9:10). Pray for your family, your government, and your church. Give of yourself by means of your time, your talents, and your treasures to your family, your government, and your Church. That is what it means to be faithful in the tasks that God has given us. That is what it means to do it with all your might.

We are planning to have a First Responders Appreciation Luncheon on Saturday, October 3, 2020. The lunch service will run from 11AM-1PM.


With all that has happened with COVID, the riots and protests, and many who have put themselves on the front lines working with COVID patients, etc., we want to say thank you to them for their service.


