SALVATION

Genesis 2:17 "But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die."

SIN AND FORGIVENESS

It is important to realize that as a believer in Christ, you are, at some point, most likely, going to fall short of the mark and sin. Sin is a willful thought or action against the law of God.

It is equally important to understand that God, being a loving God, forgives us of our sin if we would confess it to Him. Repent of our sin. To repent means turning 180 degrees from the direction we were going, and run away as fast as we can.

Forgiveness is easy for God but sometimes difficult for us. We cannot understand how God can forgive us when we can't forgive ourselves. We know the character of God not by what we think or feel but by the word of God. Upon asking God's forgiveness we must forget it and go on in our walk with God purposing never to sin again.

I John 1:9 "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrightousness.

Prophecy is a message spoken by the Spirit though a believer. A prophetic message has specific scriptural guidelines. Edification, exhortation, and comfort. Prohecies need to be judged by the believer for this content.

Prophecy should never be abused, It should be done orderly and the believer needs to be certain God wants to speak a message through them.

HOLY SPIRIT GUIDANCE

Once a person becomes born again and the Holy Spirit lives on the inside, God will begin leading and guiding you by the Holy Spirit.

Your sensitivity to the Holy Spirit's guidance will determine your success and failure in your walk with God.

Romans 8:14 "For as many as are lead by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God."

Man is a spirit. It is important that people understand this and become more spirit-conscious. As you become more conscious of the inward man, things of the Spirit of God will become more real to you. You will begin to grow more spiritually.

If a person has the Spirit of God, Nature of God, inside them, their conscience is a safe guide. A person who does not have the Nature of God could not follow the voice of their conscience. Their spirit is unregenerate, their conscience would allow them to do anything.

BAPTISM

Baptism is identification with Jesus burial and resurrection. When we are baptized, our old nature and life is dead and buried, as Jesus died and was buried. Then just as Jesus rose from the dead into new life, we rise up from our immersion into new life.

Matthew 3:16 "And Jesus, when he was baptized, went up straightway out of the water: and, lo, the heavens were opened unto him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove, and lightning upon him:"

COMMUNION

At last the climax was at hand. By Pharaoh's own mouth came the tenth and final judgement. At midnight death was to fall on all the firstborn of both man and animal.

Just before the midnight deadline, the observance of the first Passover was taken by the Hebrews. Each household killed a yearling lamb that was :without blemish" and sprinkled its blood over the door and on the door posts. This indicated that the house would be passed over and the judgement would not destroy the inhabitants. The lamb itself was roasted and eaten that same night with unleaven bread and bitter herbs.

The Passover was established to commemorate the deliverance of the Hebrews from their bondage in Egypt, but more importantly to point ahead to Jesus, the Lamb of God, which takes away the sin of the world.

Luke 22:12, 13 "And he shall show you a large upper room furnished: there make ready. And they went, and found as he had said unto them: and they made ready the passover."
