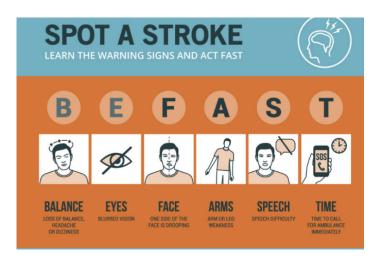








Spread the Word! May is Stroke Awareness Month!
