Calvin's plan is to drench Susie Derkins unless, as he says, the universe can give him some sign that there is a moral law against it. Calvin gives the universe thirty seconds. When there is no sign, Calvin concludes he is allowed to soak Susie. He finds her and pummels her with water balloons. Susie takes off after Calvin as he runs, screaming, "Help! Help!" The final frame shows Calvin, dazed and beaten, wondering why the universe always gives the sign after you do something.

It does seem that we learn more about the ways of life from our mistakes and upheavals than we do from the times when life unfolds smoothly. It is how we come to wisdom—the wisdom that is the very aura of God present in our lives. In fact, John's Gospel


points out that God is always the one who brings us to that wisdom; a God woven into the very ups and downs of what we are about. "When he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth" (John 16:13). It is St. Paul who notices how the troubles of life are always the source of new wisdom. He writes of how our afflictions lead us to endurance, and how endurance brings about character, and how it is our character (our inner values) that brings us to hope and trust in God's wisdom rather than in our own. In so many ways, it is the power and presence of the Holy Trinity making us new.



Jubilee 2025 – Pilgrimage to St. Mary's Helena

"We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision." — Pope Francis, letter announcing Jubilee 2025



On May 14, 2024, the Apostolic Penitentiary authorized diocesan bishops to designate churches within their dioceses as pilgrimage sites for the jubilee year, allowing the faithful — especially those unable to travel to Rome — to obtain the <u>jubilee</u> <u>indulgence</u>. In keeping with these instructions, Bishop Taylor announced five jubilee churches in the Diocese of Little Rock in December 2024.

In this spirit, we are planning a pilgrimage to the closest jubilee church, St. Mary's in Helena, on Thursday, July 17th. We will meet at St. Michael's at 8:30 am and share rides to Helena. We should arrive in time for confessions at 10:00 am, Eucharistic adoration at 11:00 am and Mass at Noon. We will have lunch prior to heading back to West Memphis. 

El 14 de mayo de 2024, la Penitenciaría Apostólica autorizó a los obispos diocesanos a designar iglesias dentro de sus diócesis como lugares de peregrinación para el año jubilar, permitiendo a los fieles, especialmente a aquellos que no pueden viajar a Roma, obtener la indulgencia jubilar. Siguiendo estas instrucciones, el obispo Taylor anunció cinco iglesias jubilares en la Diócesis de Little Rock en diciembre de 2024. Con este espíritu, estamos planeando una peregrinación a la iglesia jubilar más cercana, Santa María en Helena, el jueves 17 de julio. Nos reuniremos en San Miguel a las 8:30 a. m. y compartiremos el transporte a Helena. 

Dear Padre,

What does the Church teach about respect for the body after death? Is burial the most respectful? It's certainly the most expensive. What about donating your body to science? Or cremation? If someone is cremated, can the ashes be kept respectfully by a family member, or do they have to be buried?

Your question serves as a summation of current practice and exposes the real-life dilemma and choices facing loved ones: "How can I be respectful and at the same time practical?"



Catholics believe that the body of the deceased must be respected and not simply disposed of without care or concern. Current practice allows for burial, cremation, and the donation of the body to science, and choices depend in large part on tradition, culture, and economic circumstances. If someone chooses to donate to medical science, it is with the understanding that the body will be cremated or properly buried. If cremation is the chosen option, proper burial of the cremains in a sacred place is required.

All of this assumes an uneventful passing of the deceased person. It does not account for war, disease, or disaster. When faced with ordinary, rather than extraordinary, circumstances, loved ones have a real opportunity to be grateful and thankful for the chance to mourn, grieve, and show respect for the person. Unfortunately, that is not always the case in today's world. .
