How a Servant Thinks:

God is more interested in why we do something than in what we do.

Servants serve God with a mindset of 5 attitudes:

- Servants think more about others than about themselves.

True humility: not thinking less of ourselves, but thinking of ourselves less! When was the last time you emptied yourself for someone else's benefit?

- Servants think like stewards, not owners.

More people are sidetracked by serving individualistic materialism than anything else. How are you handling the resources God has entrusted you? Time, money, etc?

- Servants think about their work, not what others are doing.

They don't compare, criticize, or compete with other servants.

- Servants base their identity/worth in Christ, as a Child of God.
- Servants think of their ministry/life as an opportunity, not an obligation.

How do I show that I am more concerned about serving others than being served?

How a Servant Acts:

- God determines greatness by how you serve, not how many people serve you.
- Your servant's heart will reveal your maturity. No special talent or gift is required to stay after a meeting to pick up trash or stack chairs. Jesus said, "You can tell what they are by what they do."

- Servants make themselves available to serve.

Servants don't fill up their time with other pursuits (even "Good" ones) that could limit their availability. If you only serve when it's convenient for you, you're not a real servant. Real servants do what's <u>needed</u>, even when it's inconvenient, often staying till it's over (when it's "Really" over).

- Servants pay attention to needs.

Servants are always on the lookout for ways to help others.

- Servants do their best with what they have.

If you wait for perfect conditions, you'll never serve or get anything done.

- Servants do every task with equal dedication.

Nothing was beneath Jesus, because he came to serve. It wasn't *in spite of* His greatness that he did these things, but *because* of it, and he expects us to follow.

There will always be more people willing to do *Great things* for god than there are people willing to do the "little" things. Are we willing to do what nobody else will do?

- Servants are faithful to their ministry.

Servants finish their tasks, fulfill responsibilities, keep promises, and complete their commitments.

- Servants maintain a low profile. - Notice how often Jesus retreated from the crowds/notoriety!

Notoriety means nothing. Servants know the difference between prominence and significance. In heaven, God will reward those who served and who we've never heard of.
