

Program Overview-----

I. History

Journey Steel Inc. partners Barb Smith and Tom Garten, founded the non-profit arm "Journeys Soaring Impact" a Pre-Apprenticeship Program in 2016, as a means to introduce youth to life changing careers in the field of ironworking.

II. Purpose

The program gives back to the community by providing career opportunities for disadvantaged inner-city youth, while also addressing the growing concern of diversity and youth in the aging and non-diverse world of construction.

III. Objective

Journey Steel will provide mentorship, job training and offer apprenticeship opportunities to disadvantage or low-income individuals.

V. Apprenticeship Program Approval



 Journeys Soaring Impact Ironworking Pre-Apprenticeship program is approved by the Ohio State Apprenticeship Council (OSAC). The OSAC is an advisory board appointed by the director of the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services. It was established in the Ohio Revised Code Section 4139.02

Participation Details-----

I. Criteria

High School students completing their junior year are eligible to participate in the apprenticeship program. Participant must be at least 17 years of age and a senior. Participants must have a parent or legal guardian permission/or sign off on their participation Students should have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0.

III. Job Purpose

The Journeys Soaring Impact Program is designed to involve and inspire young adults in technical and vocational studies by introducing them to real world construction in the Ironworking and Steel Fabrication trade. The training participants are expected to participate on a limited and educational level with the actual fabrication and assembly of structural and ornamental Ironworking. The participants will work under constant supervision and will be assigned a supervisor/mentor that will guide them with their responsibilities.

IV. Learning Objectives and Job Responsibilities

Fabrication

- Work with an assigned mentor to identify and learn the use of the tools, materials, blueprints and hardware used for steel fabrication and assembly.
- Participate in the lay out, cutting, drilling, fit up, bolting and welding of miscellaneous components used for the overall fabrication process.
- Recognize the components of the structure, organize material and hardware for shipping.
- Watch and assist on a limited basis the loading and unloading of materials for shipping.

Erection

- Work with mentor to understand the difference in erection drawings and fabrication drawings for the project and be able to identifying the tools, material and hardware used for steel erection and assembly.
- Visit a working construction site and complete a hazard awareness assessment of the project.
- Safely Shadow the work of an individual mentor to see what their daily tasks are made of and how they are affecting the progress of the overall work being done.
- Identify from the erection blueprints the location of the work in a plan view of the project and be able to locate the assembled structure both in the drawings and in real space.
- Be able to verbally communicate the steps that will need to go on in order to move material, hoist material, identify connections, identify the needed equipment and propose a general plan of erection.
- Assist, on a limited basis, the installation of structural and/or ornamental steel.

• Compensation and Requirements for Participation of 12 months

- Participants volunteer for the training program of their own free-will and have the right to terminate their participation within 90 days if they do not feel comfortable, safe or intimidated by the requirements of the learning program.
 Participants who discontinue the program, will forfeit apprenticeship placement.
- Participants will agree and understand that although this is a learning program it
 is also a job with compensation and it is therefore a work atmosphere. All other
 members of the workforce are skilled and trained professionals.
- Participant must be at least 17 years of age and a senior. Participants must have a parent or legal guardian permission/or sign off on their participation.
- Participant's legal guardian will be required to sign provided release form for the
 participant's school to release, grade reports, mid-term reports, behavior report
 and attendance reports. JSIP requires student to be on time for school and attend
 each day unless participant is ill. JSIP reserves the right to inquire about
 participant with all school staff.
- JSIP will provide appropriate PPE (personal protection equipment) for each participant.
- o Each participant will be required to take 3 assessment tests. On the first day, sixmonth mark and twelve-month mark of the JSIP.
- All participants must maintain a high school grade point average of 2.0 or above.
 Anyone with a grade point average below a 2.0 will be required to participate in tutoring sessions provided by JSIP. Mid-Terms and Final Quarter/Semester grade reports are required.
- Participants will receive a schedule of days and hours that they will be required to attend work and all classes (Ironworking and Life-Skills)
- Compensation for this program will be set at 40% of the current Journeyman
 Union wage rate only for the Ironworkers Local in the area of work.
- o Participants will be required to participate in random drug testing by JSIP Staff.

- Participants will be required to attend events outside of normal training hours.
 This is the JSIP holistic approach to assuring the participants have real world experiences, life-skills and training.
- Participants will be responsible to wear daily corrective lenses such as glasses or contact lenses. Participants will be provided with goggles to protect their eyes and eyewear.
