
Cut out the Fabric

Draw the patterns directly onto the wrong side of a single layer of fabric. Cut out all the pieces.


- (2) Bib Pieces (1 for exterior, 1 for interior)
- (2) 1 1/2" Length Hook and Loop Fasteners

Assemble the Bib


1 Place the two bib pieces with right sides together. Pin and stitch the two together, back stitch on both ends. Leaving a opening for turning the bib right side out on the bottom of the bib.



2 Notch and clip the curved seams.



3 Turn the bib right side out through the opening. Press and topstitch 1/4" away from the seam.




4 Attach the snaps on both ends as indicated on the pattern. See Appendix O. "Attach the snaps"



Attach the hook and loop fastener

- **1** Separate the hook and loop fastener.
- **2** Lay the exterior side facing up.
- **3** Place the hook and loop fasteners onto the exterior side and interior side of the faced place as indicated on the pattern. Use the fabric clip to hold it.



4 Stitch the hook and loop fasteners in a rectangular shape.



Appendix O. Attach the Snaps

The caps (and posts) have a long prong that stick out, while the sockets and studs each have a center hole. The prong is poked through the fabric and then comes up through the hole of a socket or stud. The cap and the socket are one set, while the stud and post are one set. The instructions on how to attach the snaps are as follows.

1 Snap sets, snap setter.



2 Place your capped post, post up, on your setting anvil.



3 Place the forward side leather piece wrong side facing up, so that the post pushes through the hole.



4 Put the socket over the cap.



5 Put the punch on the socket and hit the punch using the hammer.



6 Repeat this process for the remaining stud and post to the backward side leather



7 Finished picture.




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- ** If you experience that certain parts of the pattern are not printing, you should be able to ignore those near the edge/border. These are usually just guides & signs.


Place on Fold: This means to draw the pattern on the other side as well by folding the fabric to the line. Therefore making two times the original pattern.




