

March 2022 Wichita Mountain Guild Meeting Minutes

The WMQG March 14, 2022 meeting was called to order at 6:49 p.m.

Birthdays for June were celebrated. (Sarah, Thelma and Nel)

Minutes: The February 2022 Minutes were approved with a correction.

*** Correction to February 2022 Minutes: The insurance on the guild trailer also covers the contents.***

With this correction the motions passed and they were approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: The Treasurers report was given by the treasurer. The ending balance is \$7, 736.86. Jean Petersen made a motion to accept the report, Nancy Wicker seconded and the report was approved.

<u>2022 Quilt Show</u>: Vicki Nightingale, the 2022 Quilt Show chairman thanked everyone for their help in putting on the show. She mentioned that there were fewer guild members so everyone had really worked hard. She had gotten many compliments from those attending about how good the show was. We had over 100 quilts. Almost 500 people attended the show. Lee Diaz sold the most Quilt Raffle tickets. Vicki then presented the guild with a check for the Quilt Show profits of \$5,870.

Old Business: There was no old business.

New Business:

LaDonna Meyer told us the Arts and Humanity Director had asked if the guild could display some Quilts of Valor at an upcoming Veterans Display at the McMahon Centennial Area, on Wednesday, April 13, 2022. The guild will supply the quilt racks and approximately 6-7 quilts. They will supply the manpower to assemble the racks and hang the quilts. Security for the quilts was questioned. It was decided we would need a few people to sit near the display for security while they are hanging. Vicki Nightingale, LaDonna Meyer and Kathy Burnett said they would serve as security. Quilters have usually given away their Quilts of Valor so Patriotic and Red, White and Blue quilts will be acceptable to display.

The Norman Quilt Show will be April 29-30, 2022.

Edmond quilt guild will be at guild meeting in April to sell raffle quilt show tickets. Their quilt show is August 12-13, 2022.

Drag and Brag: Members showed their quilts for the Drag and Brag portion of meeting.

Ways & Means: Tickets were drawn and winners were announced.

Dee Fizzell presented a fun and informative Zen Tangle lecture at tonight's meeting.
