#### March 2020 Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. There were 25 members in attendance and one visitor. Mitchie Brown brought a guest. She and her guest, Kate Starcher both received a fat quarter for attending.

Four members celebrated Birthdays during the Month of March. They are Cheryl Boydston, Thelma Smith, Nell Wallace and Sara.

A motion was made by Chris Ross and seconded by Sharon to approve the February meeting minutes. A motion was made by Vicki Nightingale and seconded by Peggy Coe to approve the Treasurers report as printed in the newsletter. All were in favor of both motions.

Kate Starcher is the Area Coordinator for Quilts of Valor for SW Oklahoma. She explained a Quilt of Valor is presented to Military Soldiers to thank them for their service. A Quilt of Valor should be approximately 60 X 80 inches and should be in red, white and blue. No branch specific fabric or materials with large floral prints are allowed. A Quilt of Valor should be quilted and not tied. A pattern was provided for the Friendship Chain Block. This would make a great Quilt of Valor.

Those willing to contribute a Quilt of Valor can drop off their quilt either at Quilt N Bee in Cache, or at Johnsons Quilt shop in Altus. A presentation will be made on May 30<sup>th</sup>. Fifty quilts will be presented to Military Members that day.

The next Quilts of Valor sew day will be on next Saturday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Community Center in Cache, Oklahoma. You do not have to be a member of Quilts of Valor to participate, but it only costs \$15 to join.

The Quilts of Valor organization is looking for a new district coordinator, as Kate is moving. She is hoping to find a coordinator from Lawton.

New Business: An ad was placed in the Garden show flyer advertising for the Quilt Guild.

The nominating committee is looking for volunteers to run for office. The Vice President position must be filled.

The President's Challenge is due at the April guild meeting. Members will vote for the best quilt. Prizes will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place winners. The rules for the Presidents challenge are at least 3 - 7 bright colors should be used. The quilt may be no larger than 60 inches in circumference. White and black may be used for cornerstones or sashing. The quilt should be your creation. You may use any dimensional element you desire.

Sew Social will be held on Friday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. You will need a 7-inch zipper a couple of pieces of fabric. The dimensions will be posted in the newsletter.

Nancy: Perimeter must be no less than 40 inches and no more than 200 inches


Barbara: No black fabric maybe used

# President's Challenge for 2019-2020

## I would like you to make a creation!

1) Using a minimum of 3-7 bright, sparkling colors, which make a splash, create your Color Explosion. The fabric may be any kind you want: satin, netting, prints, wool, linen, etc. This creation should please YOU.

2) White or black may be used for binding, outside bordering, cornerstones, or sashing. No 'block' may be black or white within the body of the quilt.

3) Quilts may be no larger than a total or 60" perimeter, but may be smaller. The content; shapes like circles, triangles, and other geometrical shape or even a 'blob' is up to you. This is your creation!

4) Use any dimensional element like beads, applique, mixed media, 3D fabric element, or whatever you think is a dimensional element.

5) Please use a label on the back, any size, any place.

Prizes awarded for 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place at the next meeting

## **Quilt Show Information**



I don't know what is going to happen this year but my thought is to continue planning for the quilt show.


