Rules for Barn quilt challenge (making a table runner)

- 1) You must use the block and colors you have chosen...All colors must be in that color family. Printed fabric is okay if it reads as that color.
- 2) You must make at least 3 unfinished 12.5 "blocks. You may make more if your heart desires but not less.
- 3) Then you must complete at least the top into a table runner. Bound and quilted not required by end date of October 10, 2022 meeting.
- 4) Feel free to be inspired on the borders around your blocks. GO all out or in but just try to rock it!
- 5) We will vote and brag at the quilt airing meeting for most creative use of their colors and the most unique

borders.
