.November 2019 Guild Meeting Minutes

Our program was a trunk show presented by Cindy Simmons. She showed the following quilts:

Wrapped in Ribbon 2. Compass Rose Table Runner 3. Chevron Table Runner from the Red 4. Paddle Wheel Designed book 5. Christmas Tree Celebration 6. Bali Wedding Star Table 7. Desert Sky 8. Wicker Basket (a Cut Loose Pattern that uses the Creative Grids Topper Curvy Ruler) 9. Summer Solstice 10. Fire Island Hosta 11. Fractured Paint Box 12. Fractured Star. This uses one Judy Niemeyer strip pack, 7 yards background fabric and 5/8 yard for the binding. Feathered Star 13. Lumina Feathered Star - has large pieces and is easy 14. Amazon Star, another easy quilt to make. 15. Prismatic Star 16. Ice Castles this is just the Prismatic Star with a third row. 17. Bali Wedding Star 18. Glacier Star - the first technique of the month pattern 19. Mariners Compass 20. Paradise in Bloom tage Rose and 22. Dinner Plate Dahlia.

February 21 - 23, 2020, Cindy will have a retreat at the Sunset Retreat Center. She will assist with any Quiltworx pattern you are working on. Please see Vicky Nightingale for more information.
