The class is called From Fantasy to Reality. She will teach us how to design and figure the fabric requirements for any quilt we may want to design. In April, we will have our election of officers for the new year.

Programs

In January, we will have the reveal of our Covid Challenge quilts. If you haven't started one yet, it's not too late. The rules are:

- 1. No black fabric
- 4. Must have some embroidery

2. No red color

- 5. Must use a tool or technique you have never used before.
- 3. No larger than 200 inches perimeter

In February and March, Cris Ross will show us how to draft a quilt pattern and then how to determine how much fabric to buy.

In April we will elect new officers. Be thinking how you can support our guild. Many of our current officers can not serve another consecutive term, so we will need new people to serve.

Pregnancy Resource Quilts



Rita Willoughby (Director) from the Pregnancy Resource attended our November meeting. She received about 35 quilts from the guild member to use with their clients. Rita shared that each girl that has an ultrasound received a quilt and a 12 week baby as something tangible after the ultrasound. She explained the purpose of the PRC in helping to educate women about pregnancy and the babies to encourage them in their life decisions. She gave some examples and situations where she personally had been involved with the ladies and the decisions they made. We gave 17 Dresden Plate quilts, 8 Trip Around the World Quilts, and several individual patterns. She was very grateful to receive these on behalf of the PRC.



Pregnancy Resource Quilts




The Color Explosion Quilt Show has been postponed until February 2022 which means you have more time to make quilts.
