The President encouraged members to post what they are doing on the guild Facebook page. This may help more people become interested in attending guild.

At last month's sew social, dresses were made for our American Girl doll, Prairie Flower. Patterns are available for check out to make a dress for her. You can also purchase a pattern at Jo Ann's. Patterns are 40% off there. A note was made that the American Girl doll has an 11 ½ inch waist as opposed to some other dolls, so keep this in mind if you do not have an American Girl Doll pattern.

Thanks to all those who participated in the Quilt Airing at Quilt N Bee in Cache last month. \$27 worth of tickets for Prarie Rose were sold there. \$65 worth of tickets were sold there for the Quilt Show Raffle Quilt. Great job everyone.

The President's challenge was announced tonight. Make a quilt with curves. It may either be actual curves of have the appearance of curves with straight lines. Quilts will be judged in the month of January 2019.

The September program was very informative. We had a hands on practice of needle turn applique by Judy Haley and a demonstration of machine applique by Carol Capshaw.

The November meeting will be a Community sew for charity.

The December meeting will be a Christmas party a Jean Peterson's home.

We are currently in need of a volunteer for the Treasurer position. Should this be Historian Many pictures have been taken for the meetings so far this year.

A special Thank You to Kathy Hepner for filling in for Hospitality tonight. She also brought in fresh herbs to share which smelled wonderful.

Quilt show report: Tickets are currently available for Prairie Rose and there are a few tickets available for the Raffle quilt. More tickets will be in soon. We also have fliers and tags available for sharing about the quilt show.

We need small quilts for the quilt raffle. To qualify, the quilt must be smaller than 100 inches perimeter.

If you have quilt magazines or books you no longer want or need, please save them for the quilt show. Please do not bring them in advance as there is not space to store them.

We will soon be requesting volunteers to work the show. Please contact Judy Haley if you are willing to volunteer.

A suggestion was made that a listing be added to the newsletter of items needed to fill baskets for the quilt show.

The next Quilt show planning meeting will be held on October 22^{nd (a new night)}. We now have a volunteer for the quilt show treasurer! Thank you to Sandra Mallacote.

A suggestion was made for an event to be created in Facebook for the quilt show, so members can share with family and friends. We have already looked at advertising on Channels 2 and 7, the Lawton Constitution, and the Lawton Grapevine page. If you have an idea for a place to advertise, please let us know.

Donna talked some more about why you should enter a quilt in the quilt show. She suggested you change your mindset - to look at ways you can grow in creating quilts. The judging process helps a quilter find what they are doing well and ways they may improve in their process.

She also talked about how a juried show is different. Carol Capshaw entered a quilt into the Paducah Quilt show. She had to submit two photos of her quilt several months before the show. The first needed to show the entire quilt, and no other background as much as possible. The second photo needed to show a close-up of the quilting on the quilt. Once she submitted her photos, she had to wait to see if her quilt was accepted to the show. The AQS Website has a list of all the juried quilt shows in the country, and the dates of the shows. She stressed if you ever decide to enter a juried quilt show to look at the areas you can enter. There is usually one for those who are entering a juried quilt show for the first time. When submitting a quilt to a juried show, please remember to make sure your quilt is free of smoke, animal fur and lint. If it has any of these items when it arrives at the show, it will be returned.

This Friday night will be a Sew Social night at First Baptist East, in the second portable building. We will be making something with cats. Dee shared a memory of John and their cat. It was very nice. We hope to see you there!

Bobby Bergquist Presenting a Workshop in February

New Hampshire's Bobbie Bergquist is a quilt maker who strives to keep things simple quick and fun. In the professional world Bobbie took difficult, stressful tasks and simplified them to teach others. She now brings these same talents into the quilting world. Physical limitations created a need to modify popular traditional quilting methods into something easy to perform. Bobbie realized that she was not alone and has shared this with others who have medical limitations. Bobbie has also found that people without limitations are enjoying using her techniques. What she has introduced to the quilting world is

"Appliqué for Cheaters"-an extension for her simple way to make stained glass quilts. Bobbie's husband and son (Joel and Brian) provide the hand painted marble fabric used in many of her stained glass quilts. Quilters Treasure also produces their own line of commercial prints of this uniquely beautiful fabric. She has taught at "American Quilters's Society, Teach America to Quilt," Quiltfest and conducts workshops and seminars at many quilt shows.

Bobby Bergquist a well known Quilt instructor is coming on February 16th for an all-day class. Her website Quilter Treasures, http://www.quiltreasures.com/

The class will start at 9 and will probably be over about 3 In the morning she will do her version of stained glass and in the afternoon she will show us how to put them together in her version of quilt as you go. The cost for the guild members is \$25 and \$35 for non members The kit cost is \$50 and it will include everything that we will need .
