February 2019 Meeting Minutes
The meeting was called to order at 6:49 p.m.
Donna Klein and Lynn Winters celebrated birthdays this month.
Lenor shared the story of the Blind Men and the Elephant by john Godfrey Saxe
It was six men of Indostan, to learning much inclined, who went to see the elephant (Though all of them were blind), that each by observation, might satisfy his mind.
The first approached the elephant, and, happening to fall, against his broad and sturdy side, at once began to bawl: 'God bless me! but the elephant, is nothing but a wall!'

The sixth no sooner had begun, about the beast to grope, than, seizing on the swinging tail, that fell within his scope, 'I see,' quothe he, 'the elephant is very like a rope!'
And so these men of Indostan, disputed loud and long, each in his own opinion, exceeding stiff and strong, Though each was partly in the right, and all were in the wrong!
So, oft in theologic wars, the disputants, I ween, tread on in utter ignorance, of what each other mean, and prate about the elephant, not one of them has seen!
She then related that the quilt show is the elephant and we are the blind men. We knew two years in advance that we were going to have the quilt show. A lot of the important information was in John's head. Dee, her daughter, and her daughter's husband did a lot to help with the quilt show. Chris only had eight months to accomplish what is normally done in two years. She was given inadequate information and had an inadequate budget. The quilt show treasurer got sick and Chris took on that role as well. A small group of people took on the monumental task and burned the midnight oil to get everything accomplished. So, if anyone feels the need to criticize anything about the quilt show, they should remember we do not have all the information to know what the committee was up against.

Tonight's program will be a community service project. We will make bowl cozies. The March program will be a trunk show. Everyone is asked to bring two or three quilts to show and to talk about our journey as quilters. The April program will be by Ladonna. She will talk to us about precision piecing. We will also have voting for guild officers. In May, we will have induction of new officers and a pot luck.

Chris gave a preliminary report for the quilt show. The earnings are only an estimate. Those who still have ticket money that needs to be turned in, or have receipts in need of being paid for need to be turned in before the end of the month.
