Cheryle showed how to do a scrappy string quilt using a paper backing. Cut a piece of paper into a square and fold it in half diagonally. It doesn't matter how wide your strips are. Sew each strip and trip to size you want. Fold in half and cut on the fold line. When you cut different sizes and sew together, it creates interest in your block. Sew blocks together in different directions. This is a quick way to make a fun quilt.
