October 9, 2023

LaDonna Meyer shared with the guild the Largest Barn Quilt in Oklahoma Project going on in Frederick, Oklahoma. They are looking for more 2ft x 2ft barn quilts to display on the side of a local building, in Frederick.

December is the Christmas Party - *decorate Chinese take-out box. Fill it with \$20 limit for Dirty Santa.*

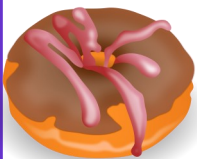
