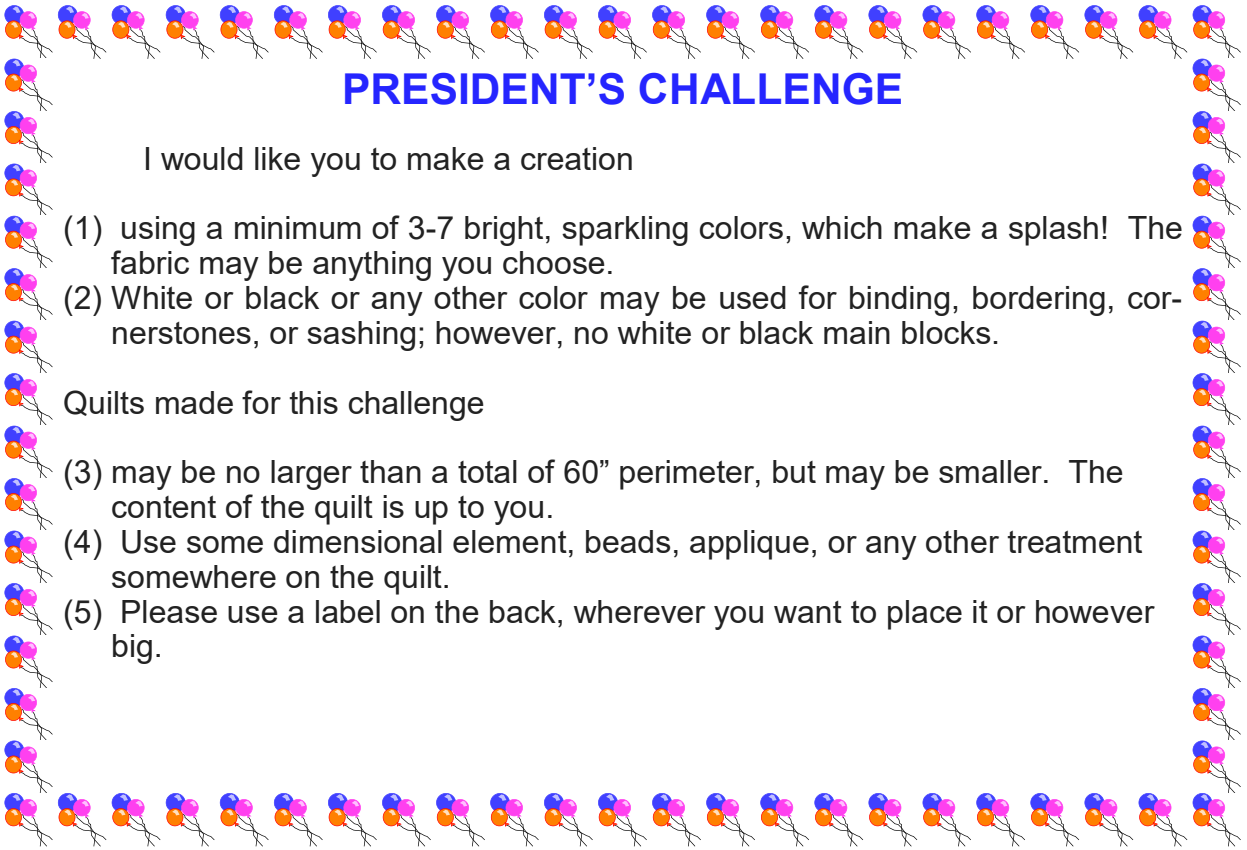

I would like you to make a creation

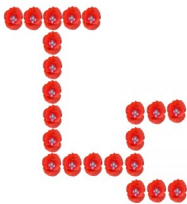
- (1) using a minimum of 3-7 bright, sparkling colors, which make a splash! The fabric may be anything you choose.
- (2) White or black or any other color may be used for binding, bordering, cornerstones, or sashing; however, no white or black main blocks.

Quilts made for this challenge

- (3) may be no larger than a total of 60" perimeter, but may be smaller. The content of the quilt is up to you.
- (4) Use some dimensional element, beads, applique, or any other treatment somewhere on the quilt.
- (5) Please use a label on the back, wherever you want to place it or however big.
