
Fun Night playing games at last month's quilt guild meeting. We had fun oohing and aahing over the fat quarters and then stealing it. Everyone went home with something.




Sheril demonstrating how to make the pillow dresses.

Supplies:

Think fall when selecting your strips.

1 fat quarter in red tones and 1 one in gold tones that compliments your strips.

I will supply the special batting for this project and other notions you may need. You just remember to bring the seasonal thoughts and a pot luck dish.

Quilt Show

You have heard the saying “It takes a whole village to raise a child”. I have changed it to “It takes a whole quilt guild to have a quilt show”. I will be asking everyone to help. It can be anything from being a chairman to a volunteer on the day of the show. I will try to do my best as Quilt Chairman to make the quilt show run smoothly. I have not been a quilt chairman before but with the help of previous chairmen and my co-chair, Donna Klein, I am confident we can have a successful quilt show.

The first meeting is scheduled for September 12 at 6:30 pm at First Baptist Church East in the middle portable building. This is the Thursday after the quilt guild meeting. Everyone is invited to attend.

The order of business for the quilt show meeting is:

1. Motion and vote for the location, date and times for the quilt show after discussion. The annex building at the fairgrounds is available. Choices for dates are February 5th & 6th, 12th & 13, 19, 20 and 26, 27th.
2. Motion and vote for the name for the quilt show after discussion. Please be thinking of a name for the quilt show. I have some ideas but I want to know yours.
3. Lee Diaz is coordinating the design of the raffle quilt along with Donna Klein and I. Once we have the design a decision will be made how to involve the quilt members in making the blocks whether it is kits, directions with members fabrics, workshops, etc. I would like to have the quilt finished in February with ticket sales beginning then. This way the quilt could be taken to other quilt guilds and community events for tickets to be sold.
4. Motion and vote on the budget after discussion.
5. Suggestions for volunteers to serve as chairman's in the positions not yet filled. Let me know if there is a position that you would like to hold. I have the after-action reports which will help you do your position.
6. Discussion on the day and time of meetings. Would the Thursday after Quilt Guild meeting be possible for most to attend?

In later meetings we will discuss what worked and what did not. I would also like a time line in January when you plan on accomplishing your tasks.

I am always available to listen to your ideas or suggestions, anything that will make a successful show.

Quilt Entry Coordinator— Prepare and handout entry forms and rules. Organize the quilts from the entry forms, prepare spreadsheets for yourself and program booklet, receive the quilts, transport quilts to show, prepare the quilts for judging and hanging. Make sure the quilts are returned properly.

Admissions Coordinator – Kathy Burnett

Vendor Chairman - Invite potential vendors to quilt show. Send invitations, application and general rules. Keep track of payments and give checks to the treasurer. Measure and mark booth before show. Greet vendors as they arrive to set up and check in with them often during the show.

Raffle Quilt Coordinator – Lee Diaz

Raffle Doll— Lenor Davis

Tickets Coordinator – Sandra Hearn (*This is a new position I added*) Prepare the tickets for admissions, quilt raffle, and American Doll raffle. Make packets with the tickets to handout to members. Keep track of tickets sold. Arrange for quilt and doll be taken to locations for tickets to be sold. Give money to the treasurer.

Publicity – Advertise the quilt show. Have flyers and book markers made. Arrange for them to be distributed. Contact newspapers, TV stations, radio stations, and other guilds. Use social media like Facebook, Lawton Grapevine.

Guild Booth – Nel Wallace

Volunteer Coordinator – Acquire volunteers for each committee chairperson. See that each area is covered by volunteers or a chairperson.

Hospitality – Make arrangements to have food for the vendors and volunteers.

Small quilt Auction – Judy Haley/Sandra Hearn

Demonstrations – – Enlisting vendor, scheduling, setting up area and possibly presenting demo commercials throughout the Quilt Show Time

Programs/Ads – Prepare a digital copy of the program. Arrange for printing of program. Contact businesses to buy advertisement to be in the programs. The vendor coordinator will also be selling ads to the vendors.
