

The Red River Quilters' Guild is bringing in Charlotte Angotti, a national quilt teacher, for a few workshops. We are thinking maybe some of your guild members might like to participate. Attached is the registration form that has more details as well as pictures of two previous mystery quilts that I made. I have taken three of her mystery quilt classes and am excited that she will be here. The workshops will be:

Saturday, April 2, 2022 - Let Me Surprise You (mystery quilt) In this fun-filled class, a kit of CUT fabrics is furnished. You can just sew and not have to do any cutting or thinking. It is a mystery-type class. All kits are the same, there is no choice of fabric. The fabrics used in the kit are all top quality and with yardage prices being around \$12 per yard. In this class you can sew all day long with no worries, laughing and having a great time with a project worth finishing. Fee \$180, includes pre-cut kit and instruction

Sunday April 3, 2022 -- Simple Machine Quilting

Learn to quilt on your sewing machine! In this half-day class, you will learn all the little things you need to start machine

quilting. Hints and a few tricks, the practice that you need and you will be quilting before you know what happened. This class is for the very beginner, afraid of machine quilting, think that it is too much for you to handle...or those who think it is really simple and just want some guidance before jumping in. Fee: \$40 includes kit and instruction

I Charlotte requires a firm count 6-months prior to the workshop, so registrations are due no later than September 30. Earlier is, of course, better. If you think your guild members would be interested, please share this with them. If you have any questions, I'll be pleased to answer them.
