Hospitality - no food or drinks will be provided at guild meetings. If you want something to eat or drink please bring your own food. Due to COVID, we cannot share. Please renew your membership. Dues are \$20 for those under the age of 65 and \$15 for those 65 or older. Nine members paid their membership at the guild meeting this month. Please read your newsletter. It is emailed to members and is also on the guild webpage each month. Sew Social has been postponed for the time being. Meetings are being held in the portables where we meet. Announcements: there will be a retreat August 20 - 23rd at Camp Wow, which is east of Gurdy. Lodging, food, and classes are included in the \$250 fee. There will be a retreat September 8 - 12 in Chickasha at the Farmhouse at Jackson. Fees will be \$335. Another retreat will be held at Camp Eufaula. This is a group of quilters from Oklahoma and Texas. Those attending will need to furnish their own food. Cost will be \$45. If you are interested in holding your own retreat, the Copper Rose will hold retreats. The fee is \$600 no matter how many people attend. The house will hold a group of 10. Three of the beds are bunk beds. So, if you had 10 people, that would only be \$60 to attend a retreat per person. Our program tonight was Drag and Brag. ric to next guild meeting or contact Donna Klein 355-6759 or 512-3977. Thank you so much for your help in getting these quilt blocks ready some lucky children!




Social distancing during our July meeting













Since we didn't get to hold an election of officers, members of your Lame Duck board thought it would be nice to have a project to help hold our guild together during this time of sheltering in place and social distancing. We decided to each make a rule and have a "Creations from Covid-19" challenge. If you choose to meet the challenge, you must follow all five rules. For now, there is no due date. And of course, there is no limit to how many challenge quilts you may make.

Creations from Covid-19 rules:

Nancy: Perimeter must be no less than 40 inches and no more than 200 inches

Barbara: No black fabric maybe used

Susan: Contain no red color

Peggy: Must use embroidery somewhere on the quilt Lenor: Use a technique or tool you have never used before

Happy quilting and let us hear about or even see pictures of your quilt in progress. It might inspire someone who hasn't started yet.



President's Challenge for 2019-2020 I would like you to make a creation! 1) Using a minimum of 3-7 bright, sparkling colors, which make a splash, create your Color Explosion. The fabric may be any kind you want: satin, netting, prints, wool, linen, etc. This creation should please YOU. 2) White or black may be used for binding, outside bordering, cornerstones, or sashing. No 'block' may be black or white within the body of the quilt. 3) Quilts may be no larger than a total or 60" perimeter, but may be smaller. The content; shapes like circles, triangles, and other geo-

smaller. The content; shapes like circles, triangles, and other geometrical shape or even a 'blob' is up to you. This is your creation!

4) Use any dimensional element like beads, applique, mixed media, 3D fabric element, or whatever you think is a dimensional element.

5) Please use a label on the back, any size, any place.
