


### April Mid-Week Dinner @ $H\overline{E}$



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




## Autocrossers 4/12/15







### Motorsports Update

#### The Golden Age

Many sports car fans consider the mid to late 20<sup>th</sup> century as the glory days of racing. The titanic battles between Porsche, Ferrari, Ford, Toyota, Nissan, Jaguar and many others served up a bi-weekly display of engineering and driving excellence. Le Mans was in full swing with



display of engineering and driving excellence. Le Mans was in full swing with large fields and great competition. Here in the U.S., we had IMSA and Trans Am slugging it out for supremacy – for several years with essentially the same cars. SCCA had a National Championship program that was exciting to watch and which in part, drove an increase in car development and factory involvement. Most fans recall the heady days of the 956/962 domination, the staggering speed of the XJR, and the technical innovation of the Toyota GTP from All American Racers. Witness the attendance at various vintage events on any given weekend around the U.S. and on the Continent, capped by the annual Monterey and Goodwood events, and you will witness the unending fascination with this era.

Are we lacking in 2015? Are we left only with grainy Youtube videos and various websites to relive this golden age? Not hardly, and here's why. On any given weekend, we have quality sports car and road racing events taking place all over the world. Take your pick – the Blancpain Endurance series, the Germany-based DTM, the British Touring Car Championship, V8 Supercars from our friends Down Under, just to name a few. Here in the U.S. we have two major championships going on with IMSA and Pirelli World Challenge. PWC has huge car counts and notwithstanding their two troublesome street course events this year, great racing and extraordinary manufacturer involvement. IMSA, though their car counts are down a bit thanks to the popularity of PWC, is improving and providing the sports car fan with an exciting show. Trans Am is rebuilding well and restoring its luster.

Purpose-built road racing tracks are popping up around the country, too. From NOLA to Motorsports Ranch to the Circuit of the Americas, we are witnessing the resurgence of the race track as well.

And the acme of all this racing? The World Endurance Championship. We may be going out on a limb here at Motorsport Report for a two year old series, but if you witnessed the fantastic event at Silverstone in March, you saw incredible *racing*. From the technical innovation, to the driving, to even yes, the officiating, the WEC event was one for the ages. Having watched the entire 6 hours on DVR fully three times now, the display of driving skill and sheer speed shown by the Porsche and Audi cars and drivers was, dare we say it – awesome. While that overused word may be a cliché, the middle stages of the 6 hour were truly just so much, well, awesomeness. The other cars and drivers were no less impressive – despite the overtaking speeds between prototypes and GT there was very little contact. What could be a crash-fest (hello Indycar?) is instead a six hour long clinic on finesse and skill.

Where is Porsche in all this action? Right in the thick of it, thank you. With unarguably the fastest P1 Hybrid car in a straight line, to the factory commitment in GT classes both here and abroad, Porsche is again deeply committed to this new generation of sports car racing. The Golden Age of sports car racing is now, fellow race fans. We are living it - enjoy the ride!
