Drive.



midst of recovering from a manipulation to remedy a 'frozen' shoulder, aptly named for this time of year ironically!



Motorsports Update

A Look Ahead

For motorsport fans, this time of year is a lull, a period of little on-track activity and in some cases a dearth of news about the team, series or drivers we follow. For the teams and series officials, it can be very hectic with final preparations for the season to come. Winter test sessions, development programs, and rules review all take place during this lull. Porsche of course is no exception, and the pace of development and preparation for the 2015 racing season is at full chat. As expected, Porsche continues work on the 2015 version of the 919 Hybrid. The new car should feature a number of improvements including aerodynamic tweaks and power plant modifications. Porsche has also announced a third 919 for Le Mans (and possibly Spa) and the addition of F1 driver Nico Hulkenberg to the driver lineup. This is no small commitment and indicates Porsche's focus on the classic 24 hour race. The 2014 season is viewed as a successful return to the top tier of endurance racing, with a victory in the final event at Sao Paulo in November. The 919 was fast, if not always reliable, and had numerous podiums and up-front starting positions. All together an excellent season. The focus is now on 2015 and how to build on that success. The first test session outside of Weissach for the new 919 will be January 19 in Abu Dhabi.

In the GT ranks, good news continues to flow. While the 2014 season was fraught with ups and downs for the Porsche squad in various series, there were some victories and a GT championship. In the Tudor United Sports Car series, Porsche won the season-ending race at the Petit Le Mans courtesy of the Falken Tire team. This victory by the customer team sealed both the TUSC Manufacturers title for Porsche and the team title for Porsche North America for the 2014 season. Porsche has faced stiff competition both in the TUSC series and also in the World Endurance Championship. The likes of Ferrari, Audi, Viper, Aston Martin and others have fought hard, and in many cases succeeded, in beating Porsche to the chequered flag and the championships. Porsche will continue its GT efforts in 2015 both here and abroad. A notable addition will be the actor Patrick Dempsey. While we are not normally star-struck here at



Motorsports Report, Mr. Dempsey represents an actor-turnedracer in the mold of the late Paul Newman as a true devotee of the sport. Dempsey is an excellent ambassador for Porsche and the sport, and will be competing in the North American Endurance Championship in conjunction with Wright Motorsports. The NAEC consists of the long distance U.S. races at Daytona, Sebring, Watkins Glen and Petit Le Mans. Dempsey will also compete in the full WEC for 2015, including Le Mans, in the GTE Am class. Porsche will continue their association with Manthey Racing for the top rank of GT competition, the GTE Pro class in the WEC. While not having the best of results consistently in 2014, the Manthey operation is an excellent partner and should keep the Porsche competition honest in 2015. While the Pirelli World Challenge series provided some Porsche highlights in 2014 with EFFORT Racing and their 911GT3R, there is no word yet on their 2015 plans. The PWC continues to expand with defections from

the Tudor series, and it is shaping up to be an exciting season in 2015. Here's hoping the New Year brings victory for Porsche. Now if we could just get past this lull...
