Bill Sholar Memorial Award

I want to offer the congratulations of our entire membership to **Bob Miller** for being awarded the Bill Sholar Memorial Award by the National PCA organization at this year's Porsche Parade. **This award was conceived to recognize outstanding contribution to the Club, above and beyond the execution of normal responsibilities.**




A little Internet research indicates that Bill Sholar was a commercial artist and admirer of well-designed automobiles in the early 50's. His first Porsche was a 1953 356 Coupe. As time passed, Bill met other Porsches on the road, always blinking his headlights in silent greeting. By late 1954 Bill was convinced that a more personal meeting would be appropriate with other Porsche owners to discuss the cars. Following a first gathering on February 8, 1955 at his home, several Porsche owners occasionally got together that spring and summer to share knowledge about the unique cars they drove. Eventually they decided to start a club.

They officially titled the new organization the Porsche Club of America, and held their first business meeting on September 13, 1955. Thirteen prospective members showed up but one had to reluctantly be asked to leave when she revealed that she owned not a Porsche but a Volkswagen, which didn't qualify under the club bylaws. Bill Sholar was elected President and a release was sent to the factory magazine *Christophorus*, introducing the Porsche Club of America to other Porsche enthusiasts.

In April 1972, the "Scholar Award" was established at the PCA Executive Council Meeting. Any PCA member who is NOT eligible for the Lazar-Blanchard Award "Enthusiast of the Year," is eligible for this award. Those eligible would include all members of National staff, Commit-

tee Chairperson, Zone Representatives, special appointees, honorary PCA members, etc. This award is not presented every year and since it was established in 1982, only 9 people have received it. Bob is the first recipient since 2001 and it is a great honor to have him in our region.

I had every intent of writing an article highlighting Bob's involvement with the club over the last 41 years but Kurt Gibson (PCA National President) was kind enough to provide me with the speech he gave at this year's Porsche Parade and I don't think I could have said it any better. Following is what Kurt had to say about Bob:




Our nominee began his PCA career near 41 years ago. This person became very active almost immediately in regional participation....contributing to autocross, rally, concours and track events. He served their local region in the capacity of treasurer, vice president, and very quickly, President. He has attended over 25 Parades and has been a fierce competitor in all areas....including participating as a concours judge for more than 20 of the 25 Parades he attended. Like many of us.....he owned a pink Ford Thunderbird before driving a Porsche.

To his credit, he has owned or driven a Porsche ever since.....though I'm not sure how many were pink. Our recipient began one of the longest running tech sessions in PCA history.....an event that rose to National caliber drawing participants from all over the US and Canada.....he was responsible for attracting Porsche factory engineers and staff to attend the event and present


material on cutting edge technical solutions to all things Porsche.

He began his national PCA career in 1989 as a Zone rep....he wrote the first Zone Rep manual...He revised the "Forming new PCA regions"... He served as National Procedures Committee chair, Zone 5 rep, and a host of other positions in route to eventually serving as National Secretary, National President and best of all....National Past President. During his



tenure on National Staff, he and his tolerant, patient, wonderful, understanding AND lovely wife served as Goodie Store chairs at multiple Parades. In fact, he was honored for his knowledge and hard work with the title of "50th Goodie Store Saviors" at the Hershey Parade.

He rendered vital service during the Oklahoma Parade assisting his long time friend and Parade Chair Ted Kelly with a multitude of details only a Parade Chair can appreciate.....ok, a Parade



Chair and a National President. Fortunately for us, he wasn't one to drive off into the sunset following his time on Executive Council. He has continued to serve in any capacity asked, tackle any project, fly on noisy and cramped airplanes to distant locations, eat copious quantities of Mexican food, and endure mediocre slightly warm beer.....all to serve an organization near to his heart.

Somehow during these years he managed to earn a living. He is a graduate of Ohio State University with a Master of Science in Horticulture. He owned and managed a successful wholesale floral business and later began to give back to his community by teaching at Oklahoma State University rising to the position of department head and Associate Professor. As in his PCA career, he proved to be a popular figure....being chosen for "most popular professor on campus". Other business and teaching career awards include development of the All American Trial Gardens at Oklahoma State University as

well as working as an All American Selections Trial Judge.....that's a position that's bound to be easier than a PCA concours judge! He received the OK Horticulture Society Award of Merit and was inducted into the OK Greenhouse Growers Association Hall of Fame as well as the Excellence in Teaching Award from the N I S O D.

Rumor has it he retired from OSU in 1996. But according to his long suffering wife, "this has been his most successful failure as he continues to work part time as a consultant for a local nursery and greenhouse" Those who know him understand...he never does anything half way.....

As you can see, he has served our club tirelessly for the past 41 years, upholding the highest of PCA traditions.....always with good humor and a healthy dose of Midwestern strength and style. He has been an inspiration for many of us providing knowledge, wisdom, history and counsel. He has been a mentor to me as well as many othersand we're ALL proud to call him.....Friend. Ladies and gentlemen, please join me in congratulating only the 9th person in PCA history to receive this most special honor.

Bob has been a mentor and inspiration for all of us and I want to give him our sincerest thanks and congratulations on this well deserved honor.

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

Motorsport Report

Things Go Better With Hope

As the racing season enters its final events, who would have thought that Penske Racing's Grand-Am aspirations would have been shut down. Even your humble correspondent predicted (ahem) that the Penske Boys would show Grand-Am how it is done. Skunked is not an inappropriate term. With their second-place run at Circuit Gilles Villeneuve in Montreal, drivers Romain Dumas and Timo Bernhard put on their best professional face and noted the difficult wet-then-dry-then-wet race conditions and multiple tire changes.

The Porsche-powered DP cars have been hobbled by rule restrictions all season, to the chagrin of the Porsche teams. At Montreal, the only flat 6 engines in the field were permitted an increase in engine revs, from 9200 to 9600. Well, thanks. Team Penske allowed how that wasn't much of an improvement, but of course they'd take it. And still the competition whined. Watching the race, hopes were raised as the Porsche DP of Dumas consistently held off the Pontiac powered car of Jon Fogarty during the middle stages of the race. Dumas was doing a great job keeping Fogarty behind him, but he was clearly holding up the Pontiac. Once by, Fogarty pulled out a substantial lead and, when relieved by his co-driver Alex Gurney, Fogarty complained that the Porsche was "pulling us" on the straights. Maybe so, but it wasn't apparent on the TV monitor, and it sure didn't help the Porsche get by again. Porsche won the opening round at the Rolex 24, and still has a chance at the next two rounds at Miller Motorsports Park in Utah, and Homestead, near Miami. Miller will likely be their best shot with the long straights, but if a Porsche wins, Grand-Am will probably not fuss much since they've kept the lid on Porsche power all season.


Leh Keen and Dirk Werner lead the points in Grand-Am GT, while the Farnbacher Loles Porsche GT3RSR at the hands of Jorg Bergmeister and Pat Long lead the ALMS GT2 standings. In the SCCA's World Challenge, Porsche pilot Tony Rivera is second in driver points behind leader Brandon Davis in a Ford Mustang. Porsche has a healthy lead in the manufacturer point standings.

Reading Michael Cotton's European Windows in the August Panorama, it is hard to fathom how Porsche has fallen so far so fast. One wonders how Wonder-boy Wendelin Wiedeking managed to bungle things so badly. It appears that hubris may have gotten the best of Dr. Wiedeking and a number of others, but regardless of where the fault lies, the consequences to Porsche's motorsport activities may be substantial. Cotton reports that any thoughts of racing at the top echelon at Le Mans, and thereby ALMS in the U.S., are likely shelved. Now that Porsche appears to be dragged under the umbrella of Volkswagen, as opposed to the other way 'round just a short two months ago, VW will likely call the shots on who races where. Audi is likely to return to the top tier with another diesel prototype, while Porsche seems to be settling on GT. This is not a complete catastrophe for those who love the 911 in all its forms, but there are many of us who would still like to see Porsche as the overall leader at the end of 24 hours at le Circuit de la Sarthe. Noted in the financial news last week was a stake in Porsche being arranged by the Sultans of Qatar, making the gulf state the third-largest shareholder. Just imagine...







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
