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



## **Mayfast Registration Details**

First you will go to <u>clubregistration.net</u>, then create a user name and password.

After you're in, go to "Search for events." In the search box, type Mayfast.

You should see the Cimarron Region logo on the left, an explanation of the event, and a "register" box on the right. Click on "register." On the next page, scroll down and read the Event Information. Below that is information on extras. Note, your registration includes one T-shirt (additional shirts are available to pre-order.) A Saturday dinner served at the track, starting at 5:30, after the driving is finished for the day, is also available.


## First Time Mayfast Entrants Get <u>FREE</u> Tech!

You're ready to hit the track, but is your Porsche?

When you register for Mayfast, you will print out a Tech Inspection Sheet, which contains a list of safety items for you to ensure you are in compliance with track day requirements. You will sign off on this sheet, and take it with you to the track, where you will also present your car for a final Tech Inspection prior to driving the event. Volunteers will confirm, for example, lug nuts are properly torqued, storage spaces have been cleared, and the cockpit is free of any superfluous objects, including floor mats, etc. Inspectors will then place a small sticky dot in the upper corner of your windscreen to denote you're good to go, and in which driving group you are assigned.

Rennsport Werkstatt is offering a FREE Tech Inspection to all first-time Mayfast participants. A \$50 value, the guys at Rennsport will look at your Porsche according to the Tech Sheet, and report on any items you might need to attend to prior to gaining access to the track. Your safety and the safety of everyone at the track is number 1. **Tech Inspections are by appointment only!**





## Motorsports Update

Woe Is Us

Another endurance race, another stunning failure. In the final hour of the 12 Hours of Sebring, both GTLM Porsche 911 RSRs encountered mechanical problems and dropped from the first and third positions. Team Corvette gleefully inherited the lead, and the victory, no doubt enjoying a little *schadenfreude*. The factory Porsches had enjoyed a dominating performance over the first 11 hours of the event, and were no doubt looking forward to shaking the Daytona monkey off their back. But it was not to be.


Both Porsches started up front and set a very fast pace in the opening hours and becoming almost uncatchable in the waning hours of the race. Team manager for Corvette, Doug Fehan, admitted as much when interviewed saying that they had no match for the Porsches in outright speed. But what they did have was a fuel strategy that required one less stop, and preparation experience over years of endurance racing that helped ensure there were no last minute mechanical failures. In the end, the fuel strategy was moot, as both Porsches suffered mechanical issues which dropped them out of contention.

If you watched the patch-work TV coverage (wait, what channel is it on now?), you saw a crewman furiously trying to remove the left rear wheel nut on the final stop of the number 912 Porsche. Ultimately, the car was moved to the garage for replacement of a left rear suspension upright which removed any chance at a decent finish. While the crew was dealing with the 912, the duplicate RSR number 911 slowed its rapid pace and began to tumble down the order. The transmission had lasted just over eleven hours but no longer. The 911 continued, stuck in fifth gear, and made it to the end albeit finishing 5<sup>th</sup> in class.

Interviewed shortly after the twin failures, the Fox Sports pit reporter asked the Porsche Motorsport head, "What does Porsche have to do?" There was no answer other than, "fix it and carry on." What more could be said on live TV?

In GTD, the Alex Job Racing Porsche scored a victory, Job's 10<sup>th,</sup> in this classic event. Again in the last hour with the Porsche solidly in the class lead, it appeared as if all was lost when driver Mario Farnbacher overcooked it into a corner and went off track. This excursion handed the lead to the 2<sup>nd</sup> place Dodge Viper, and the Job pits looked absolutely devastated. This is endurance racing where anything can happen, and it did for the Viper as it pulled into the pit area shortly after being handed the lead with an overheating issue. The Job Porsche was back in first place with Farnbacher moving from hero, to goat, to hero again in the span of 15 minutes. Unbelievable indeed, and a well-deserved win for Job who has consistently run very fast Porsches seemingly forever.

- The highest finishing Porsche in GTLM was 3<sup>rd</sup> place by the reliable number 17 Falken Tire RSR. These guys may not be the fastest car out there (tell that to Pat Long or Wolf Henzler), but they are consistently saving face for the Porsche program.
- Ryan Dalziel scored two second place finishes at the season-opening round of the Pirelli World Challenge held at COTA in early March. The EFFORT Racing 911 GT3R GT class car was fast and piloted quite well by the Scot. In addition, a similar car from the same team won both races in the GTA class. The driver, Michael Lewis is part of the PMNA Young Driver Academy Program and is off to a good start in PWC. Will we hear more from Mr. Lewis?
