

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

You should also have received an email with proposed changes to our Constitution and






Future PCA Coming Attractions!

Porsche Parade 2015 was held somewhat close-by at French Lick, IN. And even though you may already know, we want to tell you the 2016 *Porsche Parade* will be held at Jay Peak, VT, June 19-26. Additionally, we have learned Spokane, WA, will be the site in 2017.

Pam and I attended our first Parade this year. French Lick is about as far as we want to travel by automobile, so it's unlikely we'll make either of the next two.



Treffen Lake Tahoe, in partnership with the Sierra Nevada Region, is the inaugural event, September 7-11, 2016, at the Resort at Squaw Creek in Olympic Valley, CA.

Treffen Hill Country, co-hosted by the Hill Country Region, will be the first Springtime event of this kind, March 30-April 2, 2017, at the Hyatt Lost Pines Resort outside of Austin, TX.

Treffen Asheville (NC), in association with the newly formed Appalachia Region, is to be held September 20-24, 2017, at the historic "four star" Omni Grove Park Inn.






Siegi's Serves Schnitzels Sausages and Sauerkraut



Oktoberfast Success Fueled By Volunteers

Cimarron Region in Oklahoma has hosted the Oktoberfast Club Race at Hallett Motor Racing Circuit for 14 years. Although Club Races have been held at Hallett since the early '90s, initially as Zone events, this event is now one of the highlights of the year for Cimarron Region members. And the key to the success of the event has been all of the people involved, from the drivers and crew members, the staff at Hallett, and of course, all of the volunteers which are indispensable in making it run smoothly.

2015 was no different, and there was an excellent turnout of members to staff all of the necessary positions. Where do they come from and what do these volunteers do? Let's start at the beginning.


Planning for the Oktoberfast Club Race actually begins shortly after the previous year's event. The organizers routinely complete a review of what worked and what didn't, and how they can make things better next year. The process of applying for the event to the Club Racing National Office begins shortly after January 1, and is fairly straightforward. Given the history of the event and its successful execution in previous years, there should be no surprises when the application is reviewed by Club Racing. There are changes from year to year, such as increased emphasis on extrication tools in 2014, and the organizers have to be sure they are up to date with those changes.



Once the application has been submitted, work can begin on the contract with the racetrack. In an era of increasing costs, it is important to keep those track costs and fees balanced with reasonable entry fees for the competitors. This issue can be somewhat contentious as many tracks view all Porsche owners and drivers as possessing "deep pockets," and therefore able to accept any increase

the track chooses. This is not the case, and tracks that choose this path may find themselves without a PCA event. Zones and Regions view the drivers as their customers, and will prioritize their needs first and foremost.

When the application and contract are completed and/or approved, there are a hundred decisions that need to be made, from the dinner menu, to the T-shirt design and beyond. Cimarron is fortunate in having a long lead time to work out all of the details, since Oktoberfast is always the first weekend in October. But the watchword of event organization is preparation, and part of that preparation is getting things done early so they can be ticked off the list. In 2015, the organizers decided early on that there would be folding chairs and water bottles for the entrants, so they merely had to find a suitable vendor for each item. Check, done. Next, the marketing plan has to be developed. While Club Racing events are nonspectator events, a plan must be made to get the word out to PCA members in general, including the surrounding Regions, and the Club Racing drivers specifically. Cimarron uses several different avenues, from a half-page ad in Club Racing News, to direct emails to previous participants and, new this year, a presence on social media. Many drivers automatically plan to attend Oktoberfast, but reminders never hurt and new participants are always needed and wanted. Check, done.

While all of this activity is going on, the organizers are getting the word out for volunteers. Initially, it is enough to discuss the previous year's event at every other Cimarron function, whether a Drive, Social event, or Autocross. Enthusiasm is contagious and Cimarron has many enthusiastic members to help get the word out and build some Oktoberfast "buzz."

By summertime in Cimarron Region, most of the detail items have been attended to, and the last minute preparations have to be completed. T-shirts and banners have to be ordered, programs printed, registrations reviewed and approved, and all of the worker positions have to be filled. This year, Cimarron developed a listing of all the

needed positions, and as the volunteers signed up, they were assigned a position. Once all of the positions were covered, it was decided that we now had the option of moving people to different positions throughout the weekend. For example, some volunteers began on the Starter's stand as Hot Pit release, then moved to a corner station, and finished the weekend on grid. Instruction and mentoring were always provided, with the goal to create return volunteers for next year and beyond.



With two weeks to go, there is usually a flurry of activity with last minute registrations, email questions and answers flying back and forth and always, details, details, details.



Registration closes the Monday before the event, and once Susan Shire approves the registrants, the Cimarron Region Registrar completes the process of confirming all of the entries. Cimarron Region is fortunate to have an excellent Registrar, and she works quickly to complete the confirmation process and generate the necessary paperwork to make everyone's check-in process smooth. Check, done.

The final countdown begins with goodie bag stuffing on Wednesday night before the event. Yet another opportunity for volunteer help, and there were plenty of folks to get the job done. Once everything was loaded up including the grid box, registration box, gift chairs, canopies, lights, power cords, and many other supplies, the Cimarron Region trailer was transported to the track on Thursday. Volunteers pitched in to get it all unloaded, set up, and ready to go for Friday's Test and Tune. By Friday morning, Cimarron Region was ready to roll with Oktoberfast 2015.

Oktoberfast 2015 was a great PCA Club Racing event. The weather was perfect, the racing exciting, and the atmosphere friendly and fun. To all the drivers who make these events possible, thank you. And to all of the wonderful volunteers who came out to experience PCA Club Racing, thank you – we couldn't do it without you. We hope you will all come back in 2016!



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






Motorsports Update

A Feather In The Cap

purpose-designed and built for competition. Within the spirit of club racing rules, it is still essentially a spec car with few modifications allowed, so it will be a driver's series that almost guarantees close, fast racing.

Announcing the new series, Vicki Earnshaw, Club Racing Chair, said, "Our 25th year of PCA Club Racing will now have a bridge for Porsche racers to step up to the professional ranks through this semiprofessional racing series." Semi-pro? While this is

a great opportunity for everyone involved, not all is rosy. There are some members who think that PCA Club Racing is moving away from its roots with each step – awarding points, financial rewards through contingency prizes, and now the Clubsport series. PCA Club Racing was initiated as a place to race your Porsche in a safe controlled environment - to this day there is a class for every Porsche sports car. With an emphasis on "no-contact" competition, Club Racing puts the strongest emphasis on safe racing, which includes harsh penalties for at-fault drivers – up to and including 13-month suspensions. *Any* contact from a brief side-to-side rub, to a banzai inside pass is reported to the event Steward, and must be investigated and dealt with personally with each driver. Such emphasis helps to keep everyone under control. But the more incentive for risk that is introduced, some argue, the more chances some drivers will take.

Regardless of the opposition, the introduction of this car and this series represents a significant commitment to PCA by Porsche. As Ms. Earnshaw notes, Club Racing is now a viable avenue for developing drivers. Jens Walther, the head of PMNA expressed his opinion thus: "We are excited about the PCA creating a new platform for Porsche Cayman GT4 Clubsport customers to compete in.

The new series promises the thrill of close racing and an ideal path into the various Porsche one-make cup series in North America." Which is ultimately what Porsche is after, of course. Carrera Cup is huge in Europe and other markets abroad, but has not quite caught on here in the states. Rather than fund IMSA GT entries, Porsche might be looking to expand its one-make series' popularity, and therefore its customer car sales here at home. Regardless of the motives, responsibility rests with PCA Club Racing to make this series a success. Limited to an East Coast championship at first, PCA and Porsche envision expansion to a West Coast championship and more in the coming years. Club Racing will be tasked with continuing their reputation for professionalism and efficiency to make that happen.





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
