



NOVICE SCHOOL

All Novice drivers are required to attend the Novice School on Saturday 5/1/10 at 8:00 a.m. in the classroom on the second floor of the towe you plan to drive just on Sunday, you will need to take the class Saturday morning.

TECHNICAL INSPECTION

A tech form has been included in this information to help prepare you and your car for the track. You must have your car inspected before the event. Hallett loves brakes.

DO NOT SEND THE TECH FORM IN WITH YOUR REGISTRATION.

You will turn in your tech form on the grid when you line up for your first session, to receive your inspection sticker.

AT THE TRACK

The paddock area will be open from Friday 4/30/10 5:00 p.m. until Sunday 5/2/10 7:00 p.m. Consider bringing items that will contribute to your co fort--sun block, water, drinks (no alcohol), etc. You should bring a torque wrench to check lug nuts and a tire gauge to check tire pressures. Cover spaces with electricity are available at the track for the weekend, as well as garages. The event Registrar will be taking reservations for carports and garages. If you are interested in camping you will need to contact Connie Stephens at the track.

LODGING

There are lots of Hotels to choose from in Tulsa. Just a short 30 minute drive from the track, in Sand Springs, is the Hampton Inn. 7852 W. Parkway Blvd.(1-918-245-8500.) We suggest this hotel, as it is close and new and clean. A little closer to the track you can find the Budget ZZZ Motel (918-358-3591) in Cleveland.

 - 2. Clothing, long sleeve cotton shirt. Long cotton pants, leather or canvas shoes.
 - 3.Seatbelts, factory belts in good condition, or approved replacement belts mounted metal to metal

4. Tires, minimum 2/32 in tread depth (exceptions may be made with race tires).

What is Autocross? Pt. II

Driving Techniques Proper Sitting Positions:

(1) Adjust the driver's seat so that your elbows are slightly bent while your hands are on the steering wheel either at the 10 and 2 o'clock position or the 9 and 3 o'clock position. Now your leg position should be adjusted so that your legs stay slightly bent even when you operate the clutch and/or the brake pedal. You do not want to over-extend or straighten your legs when you operate the various pedals. The seat back (rake) should be adjusted so that you can put the bottom of your wrists on the top of the steering wheel without stretching to do so.

(2) If possible, obtain and use a four or five point harness. If using your standard shoulder/lap belt, try and adjust it tight enough so that you will not move around in your seat. This will enable you to concentrate more on your driving and less on trying to stay in your seat.

(3) Try and keep your head as erect as possible, that is, in the same plane as the car is in. Leaning your head into the turn will not make the car handle any better. What **will** happen is that you will receive a distorted view and distorted inputs through your eyes to your brain, thus in turn affecting your driving skills.

Steering Techniques

(1) Keep both hands on the steering wheel at all times, except at the start and shifting.

(2) Position your hands on the steering wheel at either the 10 and 2 o'clock positions or 9 and 3 o'clock positions on the wheel.









Steering Techniques, cont.

(3)For most of your steering inputs, you will not have to adjust your hand positions. However on some courses that have very tight turns you may want to use what we term the *"Steering Shuffle"* routine. This will enable you to feed the wheel from hand to hand without taking either hand off of the steering wheel. First imagine that there is a vertical line through the steering wheel at 12 and 6 o'clock. The left hand stays on the left side of the wheel and the right hand stays on the right side. To turn right, slide the right hand up to the top of the steering wheel at 12 o'clock then pull the wheel down to the 6 o'clock position, meeting the right hand with the left hand which has slid around the steering wheel to that position. To continue to turn the wheel, the left hand will now pull the wheel to the 12 o'clock position, and so on. To turn left, the left hand begins the process by starting to pull the wheel from the 12 o'clock position down the left side to the 6 o'clock position where the right hand will meet it and continue the arc to the left.

Remember: you use this process to turn into a corner and to turn out of the corner, so **you turn in and you turn out.** Don't let the steering wheel loose in your hands when coming out of a turn then grab it when you think it is straight. You will only be playing a guessing game. Steer in, steer out. Also, most of the movement that you will do with this method will go beyond the 9 and 3 o'clock positions on the steering wheel. The more you practice this method, the easier it will work, eventually it will be an automatic process. As you exercise the procedure, you will appear to be moving the wheel slowly, but deliberately.

Slow down and you will go faster!





Autocross Update



Tips & Guidelines <u>General Rules</u>

A car is most stable under acceleration

Never brake in a corner!

Enter slow, exit fast

Use a consistent, comfortable braking point

Maximize exit speed by getting on the power sooner, before increasing entry speed into the corner.

<u>The Line</u>

The line is the route around a course and through its corners which will enable the car to go fastest.


In a corner, it's the broadest arc that maximizes speed, given "g" as a constant in V(2) = 15 gr

The *"line"* and the geometry of the edges of the pavement are usually different.

There is only one "line"


Different cars require different approaches to stay on the "line"

The most important corners are those leading to the longest straights.










Concept of Apex: The Geometric Apex is at the point where the bisection of the angle of the tangent lines drawn from the turn entry and turn exit crosses the inside edge of the track. The Driven Apex is the point on the inside of the track that the driver chooses (hopefully intentionally) to divide the turn. If before the Geometric Apex, it is termed an *Early Apex*. If after the Geometric Apex, it is termed a *Late Apex*. In general: *"Late Apex = Safe Apex."*



<u>Vision</u>

- Eyes up -- don't drive off the nose of the car.
- Where you're looking is where you're going
- Look through a corner and beyond, expand your field of vision.
- When exiting a corner look ahead for the next corner/cone.
- Do not follow blindly
- Do not fixate in on the cones

<u>Start Gate</u>


- (1) Line up on start line as directed
- (2) Start when ready **after** starter's signal
- (3) Break timing beam at highest attainable speed.



<u>Box</u>

(1) Boxes are usually driven through at least twice.


(2) The course line crosses within the box.



Decision Gate

(1) Locate decision gates and memorize sequence of direction changes when passing through gate, ie: 1st time, turn left, 2nd time right, etc.


(2) Decision gate sequence can be in any order or combination of that shown above.



Offset Gates

 (1) Smooth control inputs
(2) Maintain flowing line without abrupt changes.












Even Slaloms

Motorsport Report

The American Le Mans Series Season Opener— The 12 Hours of Sebring

Know what's happening with the American Le Mans Series in 2010? Good, you're ahead of the game. Fraught with the ugliest of rumors in the off season and a steady undertow of dissent as the new campaign begins later this month at Sebring, the ALMS is facing a tough challenge. In the political world, media reports of an early demise are hard to overcome because the subject spends all their time denying the reports. So too with the ALMS. While busy denying the reports of their collapse, the ALMS has worked hard to cobble together a schedule and a car count for 2010. And they have succeeded—to a point. Part of the difficulty for the ALMS lies with the ACO, the governing body for the 24 Hours of Le Mans. The rules package for the ALMS is leased from the French organization and is therefore tied to them—and all of the political intrigue that goes on across the pond. Every year the ACO tinkers with the rules for Le Mans, and that puts a heavy burden on the competitors in the US. Here's a summary of the changes for this season.

LMP1 and LMP2 have been combined with an equivalency formula to balance the different car weights and engine capacities. Except for Sebring and the Petit Le Mans where they are still separate classes. Got it?

The LMP Challenge class has been added. LMPC uses a standard engine (GM V8) and chassis (Oreca), which is curious because that should make it a "spec" class. Hasn't the ALMS and their adherents poked fun at their competitors for using spec cars? Hmmm...

GT1 is gone. Left with only the Corvettes as serious competitors in 2009, the public lost interest in seeing which of the two big Chevys would win the class.


GT2 is now just GT, and represents the best subscribed class. Porsche is here with the 997 GT3RSR (four entered for Sebring). Also in the class are the Ferrari F430, the BMW M3, Corvette ZR1, and others.

GT Challenge is a single make class for the Porsche GT3 Cup car.

- Audi will not attend Sebring, though the Peugeot diesel coupes are entered.
- There is only one Porsche RS Spyder entered in the LMP2 class.
- Sebring is usually a tough haul over the 12 hours with plenty of mechanical attrition.
- There are 36 cars on the entry list so far—not a bad lineup considering the economy. But those 36 cars will provide lots of opportunities for calamity. You can take that to the bank.
- Defending GT2 Champions Pat Long and Jorg Bergmeister are back in one of the Flying Lizard Porsche GT3RSRs.
- Porsche stalwart Alex Job has three cars entered in the GT Challenge class.
- Porsche factory driver Wolf Henzler is driving a GT3RSR with Falken tires on the car. Falken entered the GT2 class last year as a development and marketing program. One wonders what Wolf thinks about all this as it is hard to see how Falken can challenge the powers of Michelin and Dunlop for the front of the pack.
