

Autocross Update

2008 AUTOCROSS COMPETITION SCORING

TO MAKE SURE THAT EVERYONE GETS POINTS, WE TOOK THE AUTOCROSS EVENT THAT HAD THE MOST PARTICIPANTS AND GAVE FIRST PLACE THE NUMBER OF POINTS EQUAL TO THE NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS. THIS YEAR WE HAD THE LARGEST NUMBER OF ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS DURING THE 2ND AUTOCROSS HELD ON MAY 18, WHERE WE HAD 19 ELIGIBLE DRIVERS. THIS MAY SOUND CONFUSING BUT ISN'T REALLY. SINCE THE NUMBER OF ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS WAS 19 PARTICIPANTS, FIRST PLACE IS GIVEN 19 POINTS, SECOND PLACE 18 POINTS, THIRD PLACE 17 POINTS AND SO ON DOWN TO NINETEENTH PLACE WHO WOULD EARN ONE POINT. THIS MEANS THAT EVERYONE WHO RUNS THAT IS ELIGIBLE GETS POINTS FOR THEIR POSTION. THE SAME SCALE IS THEN APPLIED TO ALL OTHER EVENTS DURING THE YEAR, SO THAT, USING THIS EXAMPLE, FIRST PLACE IS ALWAYS WORTH 19 POINTS.

EACH PARTICIPANT ALSO EARNS POINTS FOR TAKING PART IN THE AUTOCROSS. THESE PARTICIPATION POINTS ARE EQUAL TO THE NUMBER OF POINTS EARNED FOR A FIRST PLACE. FOR 2008, EVERYONE WHO RAN WOULD EARN 19 POINTS FOR PARTICIPATION.

THE 2008 AUTOCROSS SEASON IS CONCLUDED.

WE HOPE TO BEGIN A NEW SEASON AT A NEW SITE DURING MARCH OF 2009. WE HAVE RECENTLY PURCHASED A USED AUTO-CROSS TRAILER FROM THE GENEROUS DONATIONS MADE DURING LAST YEARS CHRISTMAS PARTY. ONCE AGAIN, MANY THANKS TO ALL OF YOU WHO CONTRIBUTED MONIES TO REPLACE OUR STO-LEN AUTOCROSS EQUIPMENT.

STAY TUNED FOR THE RESULTS IN THE DECEMBER ISSUE OF THE CIMARRON TRAIL. EVEN BETTER, WHY NOT COME TO THE CHRIST-MAS PARTY DECEMBER 5TH AND HEAR THE RESULTS FIRST HAND. THANKS FOR ALL OF YOUR SUPPORT.


