

# **Motorsport Report**

### Two Races, Two Championships...and a Notable Victory

Sixty-one year old Hurley Haywood won another race. Yes, the Porsche racing legend took his turn at the wheel for the season-ending Grand-Am Grand Prix of Miami and came out the overall winner. How did semi-retired Haywood end up in the car? Regular driver of the number 59 Brumos Porsche entry J.C. France was arrested early last week by the Daytona Beach P.D., and immediately suspended indefinitely by Grand-Am. But that's a story for another day. Haywood, who received short notice of his driving stint while attending a Panamera debut, was teamed with the normally quick Joao Barbosa. Hurley started the race in the car, did creditable service and handed over to Barbosa for the rest of the race. And the Brazilian did his job quite well, allowing Brumos to bookend the 2009 season. Finally a Porsche win!

On the championship side, the Grand-Am GT duo of Leh Keen and Dirk Werner started the race, which was enough to cement the GT championship for Porsche in 2009. Despite struggling in the latter half of the season, Keen and Werner had built up an almost insurmountable point lead early in the season in their Farnbacher Loles-prepared Porsche 997. Though Werner made an ill-advised attempt to pass a competitor at the last round in Utah, which resulted in body damage, a flat tire, much gnashing of teeth and the loss of numerous positions, no mistakes were made at Homestead. A contrite Werner said that he had learned his lesson.

In the American Le Mans series, their season finale was held at Laguna Seca. Without the Audis, Peugeots, or any other interesting competition, it should come as no surprise that Acura won the championships in both the P1 and P2 classes. In GT2, the only class with any consistent multi-manufacturer competition, the team of Jorg Bergmeister and American Patrick Long sealed the deal for 2009 when the Ferrari F430 of Risi Competezione retired with mechanical damage. The Flying Lizard's Porsche 997 GT3 RSTR wasn't always the fastest car during the season, but they had consistency on their side. Even a last-lap bash session courtesy of the new Chevy Corvette couldn't take away the manufacturer's championship for Porsche, and the driver's championship for Bergmeister and Long.

\*\*\*

What did dampen the celebration for Porsche at Laguna Seca? The fact that Corvette driver Jan Magnussen went head-on into the finish straight wall after contact with the leading car of Jorg Bergmeister - on the last turn of the last lap. It was an exciting finish, but it brings up a larger issue which professional sports car racing will have to deal with—how much contact is too much. Back in the day, sports car racers were gentlemen, even the professionals. With rare exception, drivers like Phil Hill, Dan Gurney, and others raced their competitors clean. The NASCAR-ization of racing, and truthfully the influence of F1, has introduced more and more acceptance of contact as a means to an end. It's unfortunate because it leaves it to the officials to decide what is okay and what is not. And officials have no business deciding the outcome of auto races.

The issue of Porsche vs. Corvette began earlier in the race when Chevy driver Johnny O'Connell unabashedly bumpered the Porsche of Richard Westbrook out of the way. The Corvette was the faster car, but Westbrook was simply not rolling over for O'Connell. Fast forward to the end of the race, and the Corvette of Magnussen was behind Bergmeister. Now Jorg has been the nice guy before—most notably with Ferrari at Sebring in 2008, but not this time. Into the last corner, Magnussen drilled the Porsche dead-center in the rear valance. It was enough to loosen up Bergmeister, but as the Corvette pulled alongside on driver's left, Bergmeister moved the Chevy over to the inside wall. The two banged side by side as they accelerated down the straight to start/finish, but as Magnussen edged ahead with Chevy power, there was one bump too many. Magnussen's car turned sharp right, crossed the track in front of the Porsche, and caromed straight into the outside wall—lifting all four wheels off the ground— but short of the finish line. Magnussen was okay, and Bergmeister was semi-apologetic in victory lane but do we need this? Not really. Could Magnussen have gotten by the Porsche without hitting it? Maybe, maybe not. But shouldn't it be decided without knocking the c\*\*p out of each other? Isn't that what great driving is all about?
