
We are also going to try and get right into the calendar for 2009. In January we have a couple of events planned so mark your calendars.

Motorsport Report

Teutonic Turmoil

Tough economic times have caused significant changes in 2009 motorsport plans, and not just the Big 3 in NASCAR. Much information is unclear at this point as both entrants and manufacturers consolidate their financial positions, and hence their campaigns for the 2009 season. Porsche may be out of the American Le Mans Series, at least for the time being. Penske will campaign a Porsche-powered Riley in the Grand Am Daytona Prototype class for the full season. Drivers will be Dumas and Bernhard, with no mention of Pat Long or Sascha Massen. Rumor has it that this is a stop-gap measure in advance of Porsche's 2010 plans in the American Le Mans series—likely LMP1. The demise of the freight carrier DHL likely played a role in the collapse of Penske's LMP2 program, and Grand Am seems to be a way to keep the road racing side of the Penske operation fresh. The RS Spyders of Rob Dyson are also gone as Dyson has signed with Mazda for an expanded presence in LMP2. While Porsche maintained from the outset that the RS Spyder is a customer car and not a factory entry, no word yet on the fate of the half-dozen or so LMP2 RS Spyders campaign by Penske and Dyson.


Though information is sketchy, it appears that ALMS GT2 efforts will continue with the GT3RSR, no doubt improved for 2009. So too, in Grand Am GT, the Porsche 997 variant will again have a large presence. But how large remains to be seen. With billions of dollars vanishing from the financial markets, many corporations and individual investors are either hanging on or waiting it out. Neither approach is an advantage to cash-hungry motorsport operations.

It's interesting to note some of the other events in the softening market: Honda pulled the plug in F1; Audi has bowed out of ALMS, except for the possible Sebring debut of their new LMP1 car; and of course, the woes of Detroit. Pointedly, Honda did not scale back its IndyCar operations, most likely because they actually make money. Honda is also looking forward to the introduction of more competition in IndyCar in the form of engines from Audi and possibly Porsche. Detroit. On the

other hand, must be ready to exit, stage right, from most motorsport activities. It will be hard to justify a racing budget that is borrowed from the American taxpayer.

It could be a very lean year.







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
